NGAGED IN SPLENDID WORK

New York School Devoted to the Task of Making Cripples and Unfortunates Self-Supporting.

From his association with the late Rev. H. Boxwell Bates, founder of the Neighborhood house, George A. Merto make cripples self-supporting and how common, almost universal, was the belief that owing to various afflictions these unhappy ones must always he a hurden on others. This was not his belief, and so strong did be hold an opposite conviction that, with the aid of a few charitable persons whom he inspired with it, he founded the Path school at 60 West Twenty-Fifth street. New York, in order to-teach rimbes commercial and railroad telegraphy and thus give to them that greatest boon, a means of livelihood. This school is still young, but it has already proved itself many times over. It trains legiess, armiess, and deformed persons, but especially the young who are thus afflicted, either in the course laid out by the school or in vidual cases. It is free to all, non-sectarian, and it has already in its short life lifted nearly, 50 poor creatures from a state of dependence, or even penury, to positions where by honest latter they earn from \$12 to \$18 per week and have the joy that comes

from self-support.
