KING CHOSEN PREMIER

Meighen Government is Defeated at the Polls.

Liberal Party VIII Have Majority Over Conservatives and Progressives—Province of Quebec With Solid Block of 65 Seats Behind New Prime Minister.

OTTAWA, Dec. 7.—Voting throughout Canada has resulted in the defeat of the government headed by Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen and in the supremacy of the Liberal party led by Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King.

Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen himself has been defeated by Harry Leader, a follower of Mr. Crerar, in his own constituency of Portage la Prairie.

Another Liberal carried North West and an independent of radical tendencies, J. S. Wadsworth, won in Centre Winnipeg.

Both Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King and Hon. T. A. Crerar, the Progressive leader, were elected in their respective constituencies of North York, Ont., and Marquette, Man.

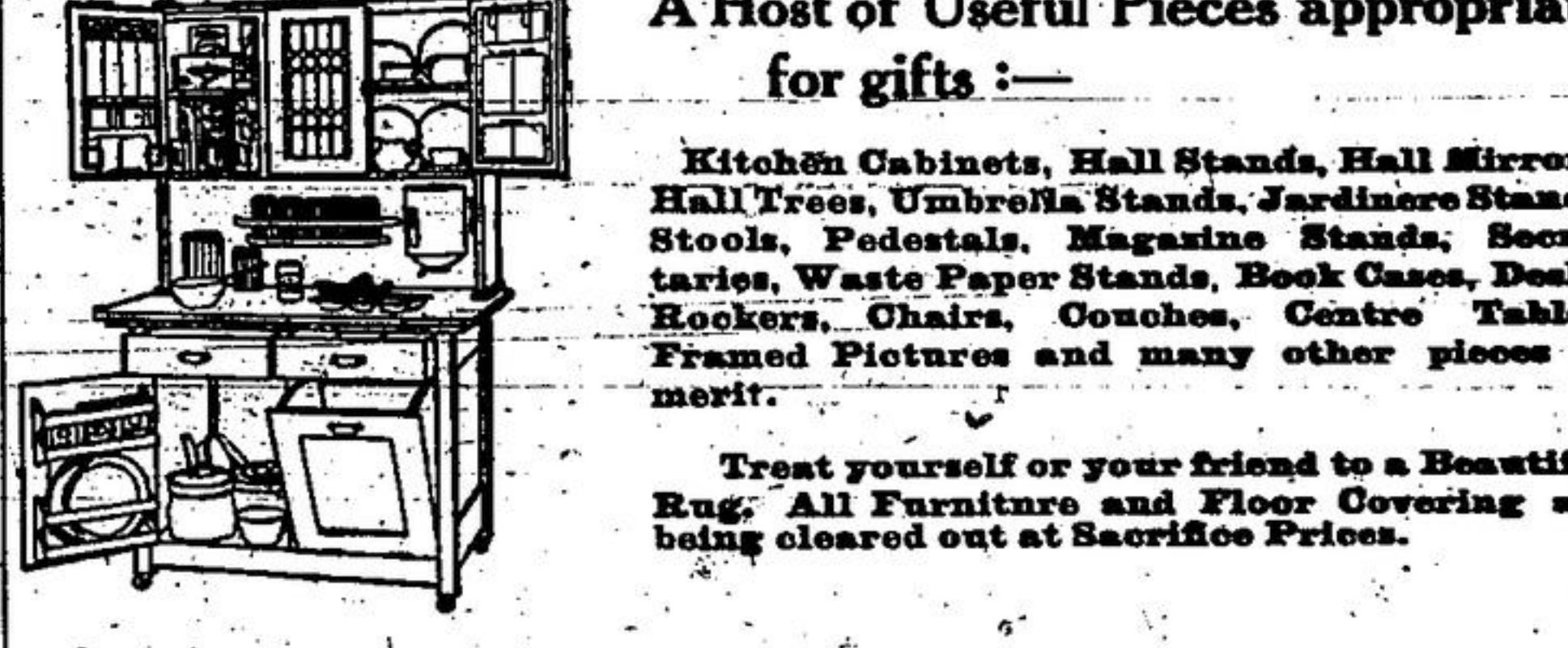
