**Obituary**

**JAMES DOBBIE**  
In the death of James Dobbie, who passed away at his late residence, lot 21, con. 4, Esplanade, on Friday, March 10, Halton loses one of its oldest and most widely known residents. For several weeks the deceased's health had been gradually declining from old age, but the end came suddenly and peacefully, and one more of the few remaining pioneers of Esplanade passed to the great beyond. Mr. Dobbie, who was the son of the late Andrew Dobbie, was born at lot 4, con. 4, Scotch Block, on December 28th, 1831, and when about one year old his parents moved to the old homestead where he resided for ninety years. With his hands most of the farm was cleared of bush ready for tilling. It was very interesting to hear him relate stories of way back in the 60's when it was considered an ordinary thing to carry flour from Oakville, a distance of 22 miles, with howling wolves along in the rear. When the Grand Trunk was being built some sixty years ago, he assisted in carrying through the rock at Limehouse and in building the railroad through that section. In 1859 he married Sarah Wheeler, daughter of the late Alex. Wheeler, of Shelburne, who preceded him twenty six years ago. There were thirteen children born to Mr. and Mrs. Dobbie all survive but

In religion he was a Methodist, being one of the founders of the Methodist Church at Limehouse, and was a member of the Board for a number of years. He was an admirer of thoroughbred horses, always having splendid beasts on his farm, and was considered one of the best judges of horses in these parts. Besides his immediate family he is survived by thirty-five grandchildren and twenty-nine great grandchildren. The funeral, which was largely attended, took place on Monday, March 18th, when the remains were interred in the family plot at Limehouse Cemetery. Rev. A. C. Stewart, of Acton, conducted the services. The pall-bearers were his six surviving sons.
