**Not Very Free**

At the meeting of the county  
council here, a representative of the National Sanitar-  
ium Association asked for a grant  
from Halton of \$5,000, which  
amounts to 26 cents per capita for  
the population. He informed the  
council that Halton patients had  
already cost the Muskoka Free  
Hospital for consumptives about  
\$9,000. We understand that  
about 75 per cent. of the cases  
from the county were from Oak-  
ville. If that is the case, then  
Oakville is the place to go for a  
grant. They call it a "free" hos-  
pital. As we understand it, there is  
a very little "free" about the in-  
stitution. If the patients are able  
to pay for treatment they are  
made to do so; if they are not able  
to pay, then the municipality from  
which they come are asked to foot  
the bill. Where does the "free"  
come in? The Association should  
not sail under false colors. They  
should drop calling it a "free" in-  
stitution and call it by its proper  
name.—Reformer.
