The "Close Season" for setting out fire in Northern Ontario is from April 15th to September 80th. During that time within the Per-

During that time within the Permit Area no one may set out fire for clearing land, disposing of debris or other inflammable waste, or for any industrial purpose, without first obtaining a written fire permit from a Fire Ranger. This applies not only to settlers but to railway section crews, camp and mill crews, road builders, including Government employees, and all other persons.

When starting fire for cooking and camping, the law requires that a place be selected free from inflammable material, that every reasonable precaution be taken to pre-
