Succeeding a stroke about eight weeks ago, Mrs. George Campbell gradually failed, until on Monday death came as a relief to her sufferings. 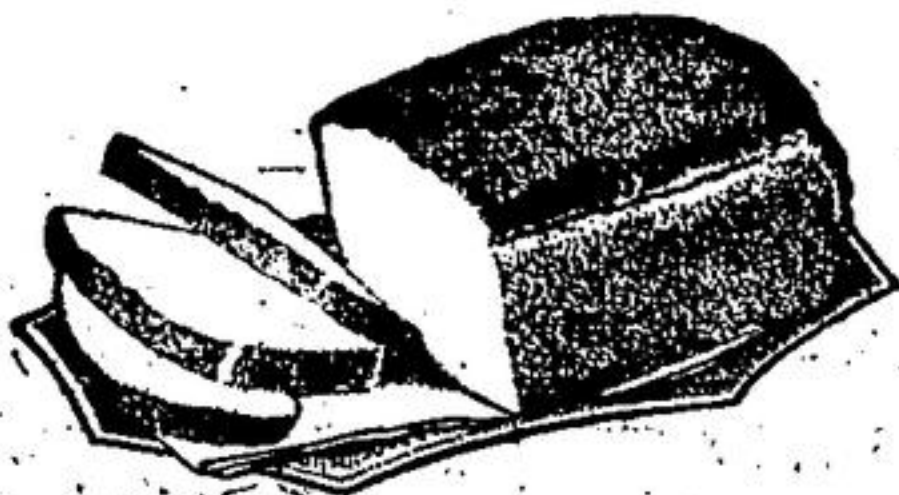
