Fifteen Sturdy Macs Are Now Canada's





A Wide-Spread War Memorial



IN memory of the war-time afforts for King and Country, of eleven thousand C.P.R. employees and more par-ticularly of 1,116 men who gave their lives for the cause for which the British people stood, the Canadian Pacific Bailway has erected at Montreal, Winnipeg, and Vancouver a striking bronze memorial group, depicting in larger than life-size an Angel of Victory bearing the body of a Canadian soldier upward towards perfect peace. These statute were simultaneously unveiled on Friday. April 28th, His Excellency Lord Byng, the Governor Gen-eral, officiating at the Montreal celebration.

At the same time was unvailed the bronze tablet illustrated above. Exact duplicates of this tablet were also unvailed at all important points on the C. P. B. system between the Atlantic and the Pacific, as well as at its American, European and Ascatic offices. The tablets are about five feet in width, and were designed by Archibeld Pearce, of the C. P. R. Ghief Engineer's Department, Montreal. The vessel on the left represents H. M. S. "Lion," Admiral Beatty's Flagship at the battle of Jutland, and that on the right the Canadian Pacific Stemeship "Empress of Russia," which was engaged through the war as a fast cruiper, and later as a transport. Beside her stands a standard C. P. B. locomotive and train as having just brought in battalions ready to embark for overseas service. The soldiers in the centre represents all arms of the service. The base of the

statues bear the same legend as do the tableta.

Enlistments of C.P.R. employees totalind Il,340 men, of which 1,115 were killed or died of wounds, and \$105 were wounded. A total of 7,573 were re-employed by the company on their return to Canada, following out the C.P.R. policy of re-instating every men who left, in as good a job as that which he had when he went away, and a total of 18,112 other returned soldiers have also been taken on the company's service. War decorations and medale won by C.P.R. employees totalled \$70, and include the following:—

* Victoria Cross, \$; Order of the British Empire, 8; Distinguished Service Order, 17; Distinguished Service

* A Military Oross, 54; Distinguished Conduct Medal, 57; Military Medal, 180.


