### The Imperial War **Graves Commission**

Perhaps very few except those who are directly concerned in its work realize, the extent of the task that is being carried on under the auspices of the Imperial War Graves Commission. The gigantic character of the labor involved appalled the commission itself when it began to work. Some idea can be gained of the progress that has been made from the following extract from a report of the operations carried on since last year:

And the smiles that cost so little "The work of the Imperial War Whose heart is it that Graves Commission has gone steadily on and much has been accomplished since last year. There are now seven nursuries, with a staff of 876 trained gardeners, looking after the Imperial graves in France and Belgium. Something of the magnitude of their task is realized when one hears that 40,747 headstones baye been shipped to these two countries alone, while 168 headstones have been put up in England and 2000 sent to Italy and other countries. The commission is now making plans for the erection of a memorial for the "Missing Dead." It is startling to learn that the bodies

> A NUMBER OF changes in the color of Canadian postage stamps are being made, to conform with the new international regulations. A straw colored one-cent stamp is being issued, to replace the old green cent stamp, which has been in use for many years, and as the various offices exhaust their supply of green stamps, they will be replaced with the new issue. The red two cent stamp is being replaced with a green stamp, and should a six-cent stamp ever be issued, it will take the red color hitherto distinguishing the two cent stamp. The five cent stamp is of a violet shade, while the ten cent stamp is blue.
