Co-operative Methods Have Been Tested for Ten. Years.

dore Farmers Should Get Into the Came-How to Control Percunial Sow Thistle and Twitch Grass-Other Weed Destruction Methods Given Next Week.

During the past ten years (1911 1924) the Outario Agricultural and Experimental Union has conducted co-operative experiments in weed eradication. Over 'ninety farmers have carried out successful experiments. The weeds experimented with were:--Perennial Sow Thistie. Twitch Grass, Bladder Campion or Cow Bell, Wild Mustard, Ox-eye Dalsy, Field Bindweed, Wild and Chess. Those who took part in these experiments profited by the experience. In nearly every instance -Like Mither's they cleaned the field experimented with, and demonstrated to their own satisfaction the effectiveness of the

Part Time For Adolescents

With the coming into force on September 1 next of section 9 of the adolescent school attendance found necessary when a good stand act, passed by the legislature in 1920, the department of education ments it has been found that rape bas issued a pamphlet to the muni cipalities of the province, notifying them that the duty of provid ing part-time courses for adolescents who are unable to take ad vantage of the ordinary courses now provided, will become as imperative by law in the large urban municipalities as is now the duty of providing the full-time courses.

Until September 1, 1923, the act applies only to persons between the ages of 14 and 16, but after that date it will be extended to adolescents between 16 and 18 years of age, who have not been under suitable and efficient full time instruction up to 16 years of age, or who have not completed a course of study that will be equivalent to the matriculation examination of an approved university.
