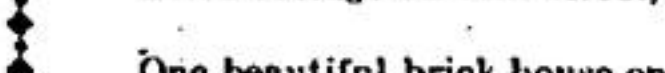

The citizens of every city, town or village should take a pride in the retail stores in their community. The better the stocks the merchants carry, the better the opportunity the merchants have for increasing their stocks and carrying the latest styles. All citizens who spend their money out of town are injuring the business in town to that extent and they are doing an injury to those citizens who patronize the local retail merchants.

Retail merchants select goods for the convenience of their customers. They study their requirements, they understand the extent of their purse, and the goods are ready on hand, ready to be delivered at a moment's notice. Merchandise in Europe is of very little use to the citizens of any city, town or village in Canada. The goods must be here, ready and waiting and ready to be delivered in so arranged that if trade is developed along natural lines, and those who receive their money from the town patronize the town, they are not only making it convenient for themselves, but also every other resident in town.

If the retail stores were taken out of the cities, towns and villages of Canada, it would be equivalent to destroying the commercial life of Canada.

Although not generally mentioned when the development of a city is questioned, the first thing that strikes a stranger when he enters a city or town is the character of the shops in that city or town. If they are poorly kept and poorly stocked, with unpainted fronts, the town can be considered to be on the decline. If the store fronts are well painted, and the stock well kept, and the retail merchants alive to their business, and it becomes an attractive place for the farmers and mechanics to congregate. It generally develops into a community hub, and the effect is reflected in the homes and in the surrounding farms.
