**Killed By Train**  
**Sad Fatality at Georgetown G.T.R. yard last Saturday**

Caino Maui, who has been working with the section gang of the Grand Trunk P.R. for some time, was almost instantly killed when struck by a train while at work in the yards here on Saturday afternoon. The passenger train was approaching the station about two o'clock and the unfortunate man was evidently watching it when another train shunting in the yard struck him. He was breathing when picked up but ceased to live after a few minutes. He was only 27 years of age, a good workman and respected by all who knew him. He lived at the home of his sister, Mrs. Emmanuel Lorisson, who has the sympathy of our citizens in her sad bereavement. The funeral took place on Monday morning when the service was conducted by Rev. Father Goodrow and the remains interred in Greenwood Cemetery.
