Four poets of first rank - Milton, noid-immortalized their friends by writing memorial poems about them. The greatest is the first, "Lycidas." one of the finest poems in any language. Yet it was written about a man otherwise unknown.

Edward King was on his way to Ireland to visit his people when the ship was wrecked and the young trafeler was drowned. 
