**Brampton's Building Laws**

Important changes were made in Brampton's building laws at the meeting of the council Wednesday. From now on all three-story buildings which have tenants in the upper stories must be provided with fire escapes. Steel garages, 12 feet by 18 feet will be permitted within the area of five lots. A residence must be erected unless it has a ground space of 500 square feet surrounding it. Permits must be posted on buildings in the course of erection. The permission of the engineer, and his sanction of a route must be secured in the removal of buildings, and all moving is done at the risk of the mover who takes the responsibility for the care of life and property.

**Another Outraged Scheme**

Another scheme for defrauding business people has been evolved by scamps, who are too lazy and dishonest to earn money for themselves by honest toil. The St. Mary's Journal Argosy says: "A few days ago a man called at E. M. Greenfield's drug store, the clerk, Wilfred Zimmerman, only being in. Saying he was the inspector of cash registers," he pulled a key out of his pocket and opened the register, first opening the compartment, then the other. His side-glance at the clerk's awestruck suspicion and Mr. Zimmerman said, "Here, you're no inspector. Get out of this." The fellow at once decamped.

**Bevee Elliott's Shop Burned**

Much regret is felt that the large, outbuilding and stock belonging to Bevee Elliott were recently destroyed by fire. John Wilson, treasurer of Milton, was engaged in threshing Mr. Elliott's grain. About six o'clock fire broke out in the cylinder of the threshing machine, and in a few minutes the barn was ablaze throughout. The strenuous efforts used to quench the fire and save the buildings were of no avail. The fire completely destroyed the fine bank barn on Mr. Elliott's farm on the second line, outbuilding, a number of head of stock and Wilson's threshing-machine. The loss to Mr. Elliott and to Mr. Wilson will reach about \$90,000. The destroyed property was partially covered by insurance.
