Milton School Burned
About twelve o'clock Friday night a fire of mysterious origin completely destroyed the fine brick public school at Milton Heights, two miles west of Milton. The Milton firemen were called out and rushed to the scene of the fire in their new motor truck, but the fire had gained such headway that nothing could be done to check the flames, and the building which five years ago cost nearly \$5,000 was destroyed. The \$3,500 insurance on the school will help greatly to reduce the loss. Rev. Canon Natfel has suggested that All Saints Anglican Church nearby be used by the school-less pupils temporarily. This offer will be considered by the trustees at their meeting on Monday night.

Secondary Schools For Rural Centres

Under the auspices of the Halton County Educational Association, a series of meetings were held throughout the county last week. The two subjects discussed were "Rural Secondary Schools" and "Curricula of Public and High Schools." Opinion has been freely expressed that under the provisions of recent legislation, the country districts should be able to enjoy equal privileges for secondary education with the towns and that these privileges should be placed within reach of every boy and girl in the rural parts. It is likely that next year will see definite steps taken in Halton for the establishment of continuation schools.

The opinion was also expressed that the rural continuation schools should have a special character in keeping with the demands of rural life and aims. With reference to the curriculum of the Public school, it was felt that the course is too extensive for thorough work in the one roomed school, but the difficulty is to determine any one subject which could profitably be omitted.

Directors were elected at each township meeting, who will form the county executive. The president of the association is W. H. Cadmore, Bronte, and M. A. Campbell, of Zimmerman, is secretary.

Hillburg U.F.O. Store Assigned
The Hillburg Co-operative, Ltd., last week assigned to Mr. G. Powell Hamilton, of Guelph. The headquarters of the concern were in the village of Hillburg, where a store and elevator was situated and a general merchandise, potato and grain business transacted. For some time past affairs have not been going well with the concern, and it has been losing money steadily. While no definite figures are available it is understood that the liabilities will far exceed the assets. A meeting of the creditors will be called in due course. It was operated by the U.F.O. of that section.
