County Judge's Criminal Court

The four men, George Thompson, Alvin Panton, Samuel Miller alias Green, Geo. Hicks and Frank Carter, committed for trial on the charge of pocket picking on Milton fair day, were tried by Judge Elliott yesterday. Crown Attorney Dick prosecuted and Messrs. J. W. Curry, K.C., of Toronto, M. J. O'Reilly, K.C., of Hamilton, and T. A. Hutchinson, Milton, defended the prisoners. The court room was full, morning and afternoon. Panton and Green were tried in the morning and Carter and Hicks in the afternoon. In both cases the evidence in the prosecution was the same as that given before the Police Magistrate.
Carter went into the witness box for the defence in both cases. He said he was hired by Hicks to bring him and four others to the fair, two of them being Panton and Green, whom he had not known before.
