Twenty years ago the foundation stone of St. Alban's Church was laid by the Grand Master and of A.F. & A.M. of Ontario and on the 24th of June 1908, St. John the Baptist's day, the church was dedicated and opened by Dr. DuMoulin Bishop of Niagara, the preacher being the Rev. G. F. Davidson of Guelph while the Rector of the Parish was the Rev. T. G. Wallace now Rector of St. Stephen's Church, Toronto. Next Sunday the church will be re-opened after extensive repairs to the fabric and the 20th anniversary kept. The re-opening service will take place at 11 o'clock and the service in the evening will be at 7 o'clock when the choir of the Mother Church, St. George's, will render the musical portion of the service as they did at the opening service 20 years ago. The special preacher will be the Rev. F. H. Cosgrave B.D. of Trinity University, Toronto one of the most scholarly and best known clergymen in the Anglican church.
