GETTING RID OF WEEDS

Results of Co-operative Experiments on Ontario Farms.

Over Eighty Farmers Have Experimented-Rape for Perennial Now Thistle and Twitch Grass-Bradication of Bladder Campion and Cow-Bell.

In 1911 experiments were begun' with the object of gathering data from which definite statements might be made regarding the best methods of controlling the various bad werds of the Province. In this connection over elably farmers bave carried on successful experiments on their un. farms under instructions sent frame Why that's the best game of them | the Director at the O. A. C., Guelpit The weeds experimented with wel-Perennial Sow Thistle, Twitch Grass Bladder Campion or Cow Bell, With Mustard, Ox-Eye Dalsy, Field Bind weed. Wild Oats 'and 'Chess. In nearly every instance they elequed the field experimented with, and d. monstrated to their own astisfaction the effectiveness of the method tried. As a result of the data gathered from these experiments it is now pos sible to recommend with confidence

> Wild Mustard. The Rape Method for the Control o Perennial Sow Thistie and Twitch

Cultivate the field until about the middle of June, running over it frequently with a cultivator so as to points should be used, which will cut off the Sow Thistie or Twitch Grass below the surface of the ground and not break up the rootstocks too much. About the middle of June apply manure at the rate of about twenty tons per acre (twelve good loads.) Cultivate the manure in thoroughly and with a double mould board plough slightly ridge up the land, making the ridges about twenty-six inches apart On the ridges sow pasture rape (Dwarf Essex var-lety) at the rate of about one and a half pounds per acre. It is important that the right amount of rape be sown for if too little is sown the stand will not be thick enough to smother the weeds; and if, on the other hand, too much is sown the rape plants will be too crowded and now grow vigorously enough to keep thead of the twitch grass or sow thissufficiently moist to secure quick germination of the seed. if the rape, is slow in starting the twitch grass or sow thistle may get a hold in the rows and thus necessitate hand cultivation. Cultivate the rape every week or ten days until it occupies all the ground and makes further cultivation impossible. If, when the rape is cut or pastured, any of the woods remain, the field should be ridged up last thing in the fall and put in with another hoed crop the following year. This has not been found necessary when a good stand of rape

has been secured. Eradiction of Bladder Campion o Badly infested fields should be ploughed deeply in the fail and then cultivated and cross-cultivated with a broad-shared cultivator in order to break up and weaken the under-ground rootstocks. In the spring this cultivation should be repeated frequently enough to prevent the plant making any growth above ground until it is time to put in a noed crop, which must be kept thor-A well cared for corn crop planted in hills so that it can be cultivated both ways has been found to give excellent results. Special attention must be given to hosing out any bladder campion plants which may appear in the corn crop and which are not destroyed by cultivation. One fall and one spring's thorough cultivation followed by a well cared for hoed crop has been found to destroy practically all the bladder campion

Preventing Mustard Seeding I

Cercal Crops. Iron sulphate or Copperas can be auccessfully used to destroy mustard the crop. A 20 per cent. solution should be applied. This can be prepared by dissolving 80 pounds of iron sulphate in forty gallons of water. fron sulphate is dissolved quite read-Cream liv in cold water. 
Neptune Holds Court on a Famous Canadian Ship




