

THE DREAMER

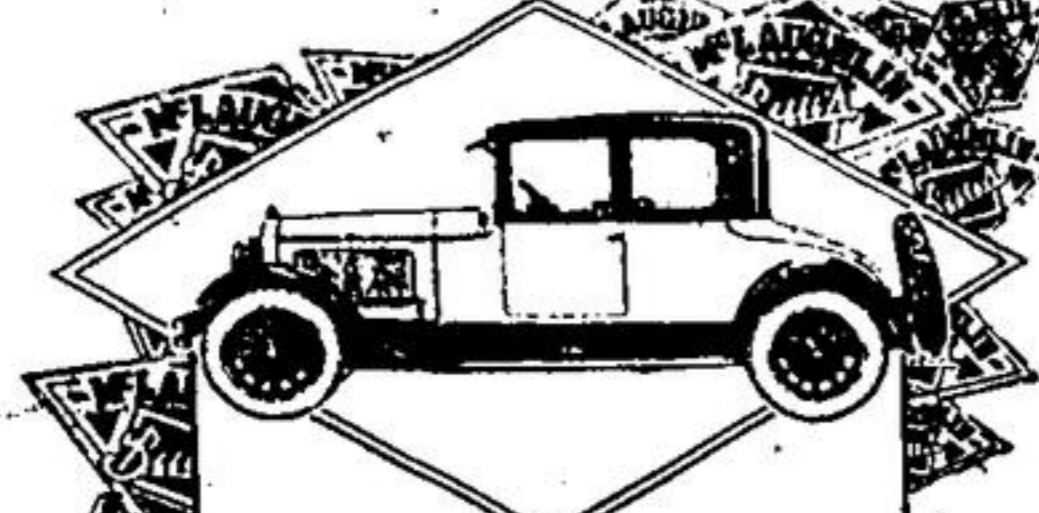
I am tired of planning and toiling

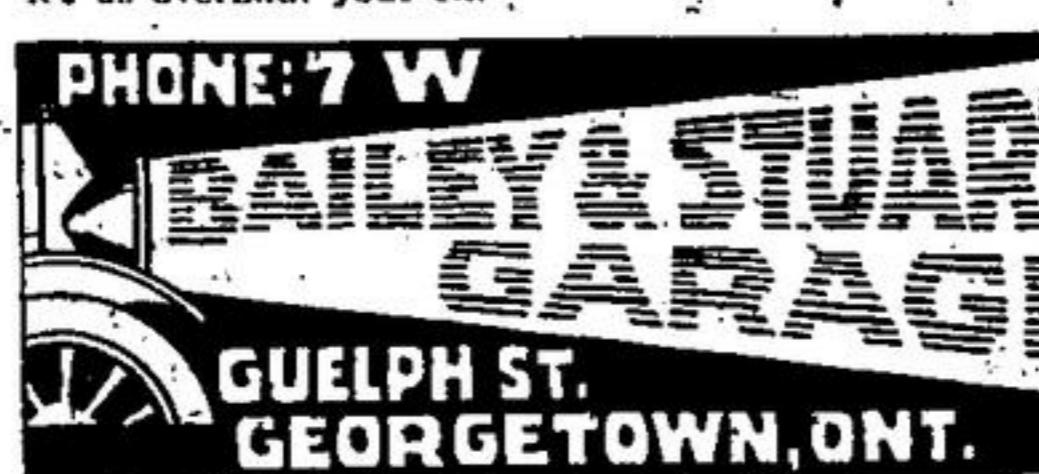

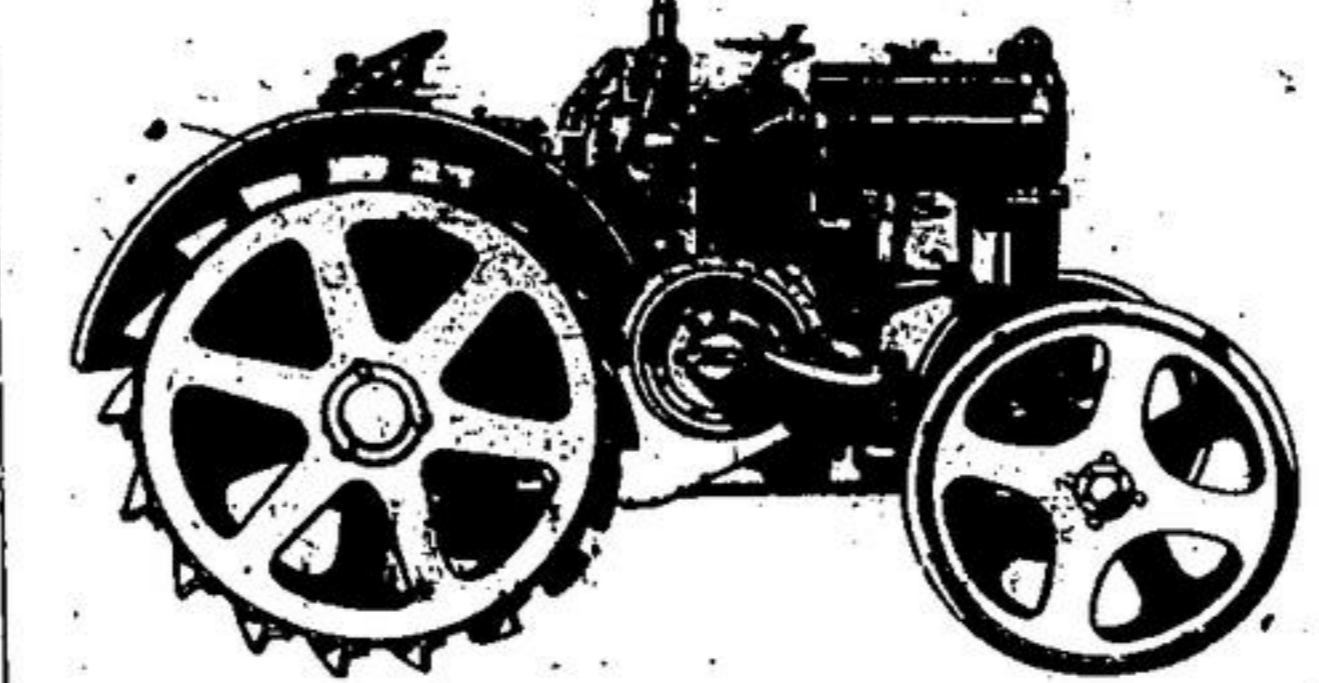
