Most Put in Fire Escapes

The standard type must comply with laws for fire prevention and provide fire escapes in order to secure licenses for next year. Instructions have been sent out to license inspectors who will issue the license and there must be a rope placed in every room above the ground floor and secured to the inside of the window frame so that the occupants may escape in event of a fire.
