

Aiding Farmers To Get Labor

A free employment service, whereby farmers in need of labor, will be brought into touch with newly-arrived immigrants who are looking for farm work, has been organized by the Canadian National Railways in preparation for the opening of the coming immigration season. By means of this service immigrants, arriving in Canada, will be advised of places awaiting them, and farmers who require help during the next few months, will be able to secure such help from the newcomers without cost to themselves. When the immigration policy of the Canadian National Railways was drawn up it was considered that an important feature in the success of any immigration policy would be to assure that the immigrants could find work when they arrived in Canada. With this end in view machinery has been organized by means of which farmers may make their application to the nearest Canadian National Railways agent stating their requirements, and on their arrival of immigrants in search of farm work, these men will be directed to places awaiting them. The influx of immigration is expected to commence by about March 15th and farmers are urged to make their applications as early as possible. The service is free and is designed to assist both the immigrants and farmers who are in need of labor during the coming season.

Reducing Production Costs

Every manufacturer in the country is faced constantly by the problem of reducing his production costs. If he can save a dollar it is just as good as the dollar he may earn. Accidents have laid a heavy hand on industry in Ontario when we realize that compensation for accidents in this Province is costing six million dollars each year. The manufacturer must calculate on this cost with his other problems of manufacture and a reduction in these losses means just that much saved to the country.

Accidents reported to the Workmen's Compensation Board have averaged over 6000 each month for the last several months. This means roughly two hundred accidents every working day and does not benefit either the industry or the workers—but, rather, a heavy loss to both employer and employee.

An extension of the safety idea seems a logical and legitimate means of cutting production costs in this country.

Disco Has Gone. It is no longer lawful to sell oleomargarine in Canada. The manufacturer of the product in Canada was prohibited after September 1st last. In view of the failure of the Ottawa Government to renew to the trade the right to sell or manufacture to make oleomargarine at the last session, those who handled the product were careful to see that stocks were cleared, so that for some time now the product has been practically off the Canadian market. Permission to make and sell oleomargarine was a war measure and during the period intervening the product became popular, especially at seasons when the price of butter mounted. It had a very wide sale in this country. The banning of the product from Canada will have its effect on the butter market. It removes the one competitive factor, so that, all things being even, the range of butter prices over a given period will undoubtedly be higher. While many consumers may feel the pinch of higher prices, the producer of butter will benefit.
