

Stronger Beer Bill Was Voted Down

The Ontario Temperance Act remained firmly entrenched, and even gained in stringency in the Ontario Legislature Thursday. By a vote of 84 to 6 the Chamber threw out the bill for seven per cent beer, introduced by J. A. Pinard (Liberal, East Ottawa). Such action was consistent with the fact that only a few minutes before the House had taken the first step to cut off the drug store as the source of the thirsty and had then voted to amend the amendments from Hon. Mr. Nickle, designed to close some of the loopholes of the O.T.A.

The Nickle amendments were of more importance than the Pinard bill, for, as pointed out by the Government, they were reasonably assured of passage through the House. Their effect is threefold: In the first place, they require a druggist to file monthly returns with the Government of the liquor prescribed for sale and to take out a further license in order to be able to deal in liquor at all; violation of the liquor laws by a druggist in future will, upon a first offence, render him liable to cancellation of his license, as well as to the penalties of the Act, and, upon a second offence, his license is automatically cancelled; in the second place the amendments place medicinal wines upon a 24 per cent basis and forbid greater alcoholic strength; in the third place, Mr. Nickle pointed out that many reputedly medicinal wines were being used as beverages and were prohibited from being sold in the Province of Quebec. The final amendment provides for the confiscation of motor vehicles caught in the illicit transport of liquor.

Get Your Dog
Have you secured a tax for your dog yet? According to the Dog Tax and Sheep Protection Act, every dog which does not wear a tag, and which, if found off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person, may be killed by any person. Every owner of a dog who neglects to comply with the provisions of this section shall incur a penalty of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$20.00 for each offence.

Last week, as reported in the Champion, Police Magistrate Moore, fined Allan Bowman \$10 for being drunk and committed him to jail for 2 months for refusal to say where he got the liquor, to be released within that time on giving the information. Bowman shows no sign of weakening and is expected to put in the full time, boarding at the public expense. He lives at Peru, not Milton Heights, as stated last week.

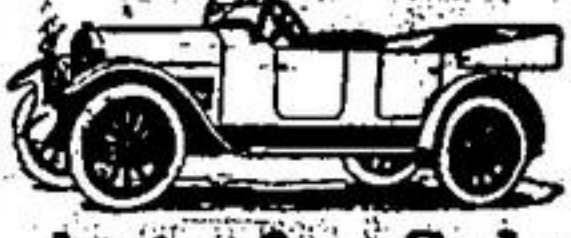
