

The main provision of the new law is that it provides that all druggists must take out a license from the Ontario License Board before they can store, handle or sell alcohol or liquor Under the new legislation the penalties are very much heavier. Violation of the measure will subject the offender to a fine of \$2,000, with or without imprisonment In the case of incorporated companies the maximum penalty of \$2,000 becomes the minimum, or may be made as much as possible at the discretion of the magistrate.
