Big Fire at Acton

Beardmore & Co's Plant Damaged to the Extent of \$75,000

Fire gutted a portion of the sole leather department of the Beardmore Tanning Company's plant in Acton on Saturday night, and it is estimated that the total loss will exceed \$75,000 and may be close to \$100,000. The super-structure of the department, covering a large area, was destroyed.

The call was received by the Acton Fire department at 12:30 o'clock on Sunday morning, and was rung in by George Cardona, night-watchman of the Acton Tanning Company, another of the Beardmore interests. He noticed the fire as it was licking at the roof of the store-house from the inside and immediately sent word of it to the Fire Department.
