ENGLAND WILL SUPPORT CANADIAN ENTERPRISES

Before leaving England recently after a short visit to that country, E. W. Beatty, president of the Canadian Pacific Railway said "I cannot help but regard Canada as the greatest actual potential asset in the Empire, and when exchange is at parity I feel quite confident that England will support Canadian enterprises and Canadian development will be very extensive."

WITH THE ADVENT of the exhibition and fall fair season, the effort to impress on the Canadian people the desirability of buying produced-in-Canada goods is being renewed.

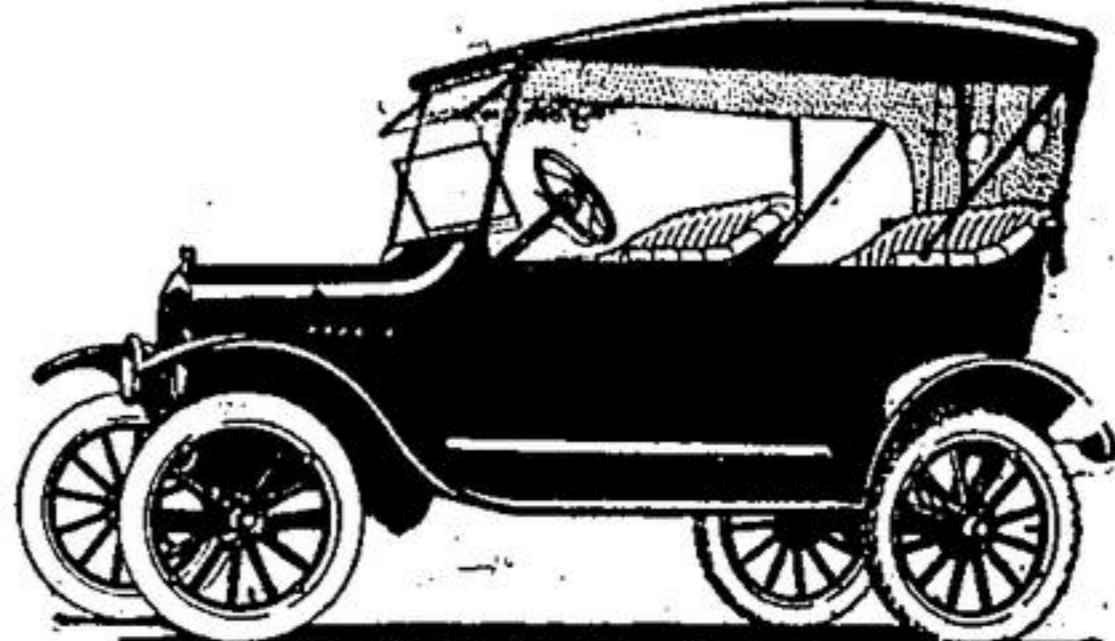
