She Was Too Sick To Try Entrance Exams.

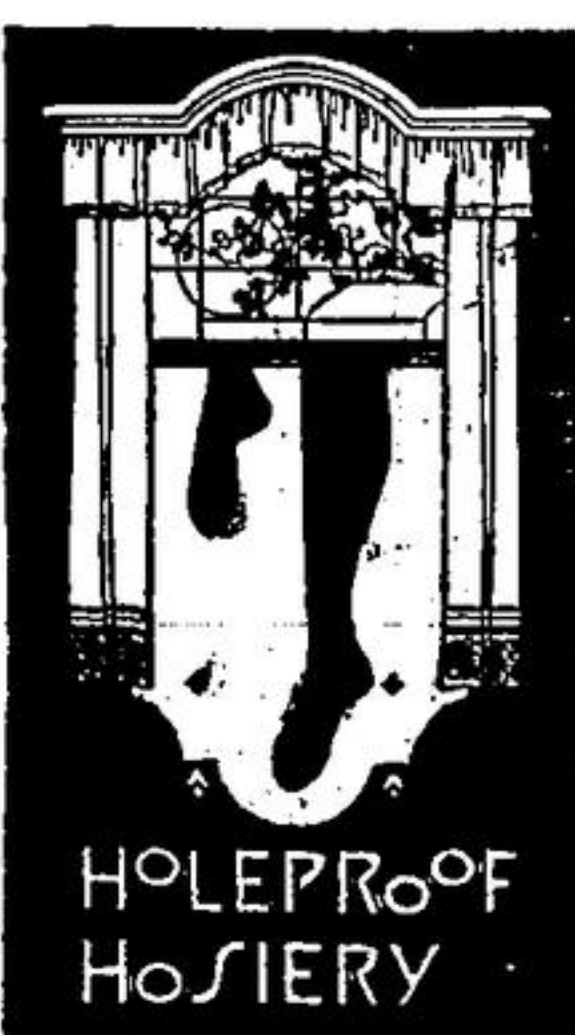
