**Observe 103rd Anniversary**  
The 103rd anniversary of the  
founding of the congregation of  
Grace Methodist Church, Brant  
ton, and of the 57th anniversary  
of the present church building,  
were fittingly celebrated by special  
services on Sunday last. The first  
church building erected in 1842,  
cost \$1,200. The second church  
edifice cost \$8,500. In the year  
1888, improvements costing \$30,  
000 were authorized. By 1898 the  
church was clear of debt and has  
remained so up to the present day.  
A Sunday school building costing  
\$60,000 was erected in 1924 and  
\$40,000 of the total cost has al-  
ready been paid. In addition, Mr.  
and Mrs. T. W. Dugan gave the  
church a \$10,000 organ. The  
special sermons were delivered by  
Rev. D. S. Cleaver.

**In Business at Cookville**  
Mr. Frank F. Sayers formerly of  
Nassagaweya and lately of Toron-  
to, has purchased a lumber busi-  
ness at the C.P.R. station at  
Cookville. On the property is a  
fine new brick house. Mr. Sayers

nership, with the new firm name  
of F. Sayers & Son. With the in-

**Financing O. A. C.**  
The experimental farm at  
Geolph, operated by the Ontario  
Government in connection with  
the Ontario Agricultural Society,  
earned nearly \$50,000 last year al-  
though it was not self sustaining.  
On both college and farm the pro-  
vince spent \$209,000, but the col-  
lege alone produced a revenue of  
\$180,000. The farm proper  
brought in a revenue of \$18,000.  
The dairy department earned \$18,  
000. The poultry brought in \$17,  
902. The number taking the gen-  
eral course at the college was 448,  
short courses 892, domestic science  
408 and summer courses 321. The  
domestic science course was the  
only one to show an increase.

**Mr. A. G. Claridge Injured**  
When Mr. A. G. Claridge was  
returning from town on Tuesday  
evening 7th inst., about ten o'clock  
his horse became frightened at the  
Queen street crossing of the C.N.  
R. when a freight train was ap-  
proaching. Fortunately the animal

the side. This course however  
was very rough, and Mr. Claridge  
was thrown out of the cutter and  
he sustained painful injuries to  
the fall. His daughter, Genevieve,  
came along shortly after and as-  
sisted him home. Mr. Claridge  
is still confined to bed, but is re-

**Cataract Electric Plant Sold**  
Harris and Harris of Toronto,  
were the successful bidders at the  
auction sale of the Cataract Elec-  
tric Company, held Saturday, and  
they got possession Monday. The  
new owners paid \$44,000.00. The  
Cataract Company, which went in-  
to liquidation four months ago,  
had liabilities amounting to  
\$63,245.04, \$39,000.00 being secured  
creditors, whose claims amount to  
\$24,844.84, will not receive much.  
That concern has a generating  
station at Cataract, with distribu-  
tion lines in the County of Peel,  
Wellington and Dufferin, serving  
the Townships of Erin, Caledon  
and Chinguacousy, the Villages of  
Cheltenham, Caledon, Erin, Hills-  
burg and Alton, and Orangeville  
in opposition to the Hydro.
