IN THE AMENDMENTS to the school laws of Untario there is a new definition of County pupils which is as follows. > IN THE FIRST three months of 1925 there were 46 deaths due to industrial accidents in Ontario. In the same period of -1924 there were 92 deaths. This decrease is quite extraordinary, especially when it is remembered that the number of industrial deaths in Obtario has averaged over 80 a month for the past several years. The value of these 46 lives can hardly be estimated, but the reduction at more care and thought being used by all concerned.
