At the evening service the speaker chose his text from the 9th verse of the 9th chapter of St. Matthew, viz: "Follow Me," and said in part:

"The harvest time is a call to all of us to give ourselves more fully to God than ever before, in ceaseless loyalty to Him and show our gratitude not only with our lips but in our lives. Jesus called us to follow Him and begin the work of the church and he is still calling men to-day. We are called to be true followers of Jesus Christ. How can we become better followers of Him? By perfect obedience to God our Father and do his will. The Son of Man came not to be ministered unto but to minister to others. Jesus taught humble service. There is no such thing as menial labor; there may be menial laborers but not labor. Who are called? All are called by God and need is what constitutes the call. The greatest service in the world is that of a Christian minister. Jesus called us to service when he said follow Me. Beware of covetousness for covetousness is not in his nature. He is exceptionally well rendered and added much to the impressiveness of the services.

School Athletics The Ontario public, separate high and preparatory school track and field championship will be held at Varsity stadium, Toronto, on Wednesday, September 30, under the auspices of the Ontario athletic commission. This is the first attempt to hold an Ontario championship meet for school boys and is the greatest undertaking of the kind ever attempted in Canada. The province has been divided into nine districts. The schools in each district will send their representatives to the elimination meet in each section and the winners will meet in Toronto on the last day of the month. All expense of sending the winners to Toronto will be borne by the Ontario Athletic Commission. The undertaking has the support and cooperation of the Premier of Ontario and the department of education. It will bring together in athletic competition, boys from every section of the province, the lads from Thunder Bay and Northern Ontario clashing on the cricket path with boys from Central, Western, and Eastern Ontario and the Niagara valley.

School Athletics The elimination meet for a district is being held at Oakville, on Saturday, September 26. A huge entry is assured as the various schools in the counties of York, Peel, Halton, Wentworth, Hamilton, Lincoln and Welland, have manifested keen interest. With two classes open to public school boys, and three to high schools, qualifications by weight and age, there is ample room for all. Entry blanks are in the hands of the various principals.
