

The central region of the Canadian National Railways, will shortly put into operation a new type of diesel electric passenger-carrying car operated by electricity developed by a generator installed within the body of the car.

On a preliminary trial trip made recently, one car started from Montreal to Toronto in approximately 8 hours and 30 minutes, actual running time. No difficulty was experienced, and the engine was not stopped once between those two points.

On a trip from Port Hope to Lakefield, the same day, the car hauled a coach and a trailer, and it was able to negotiate very heavy grade at a moderate speed.

Announcement has been made of the appointment of Rev. Mr. Lane has been pastor of the Drumbo and Princeton circuit for the past five years. Mr. Williamson is a war veteran and a graduate of the Ontario Agricultural College.

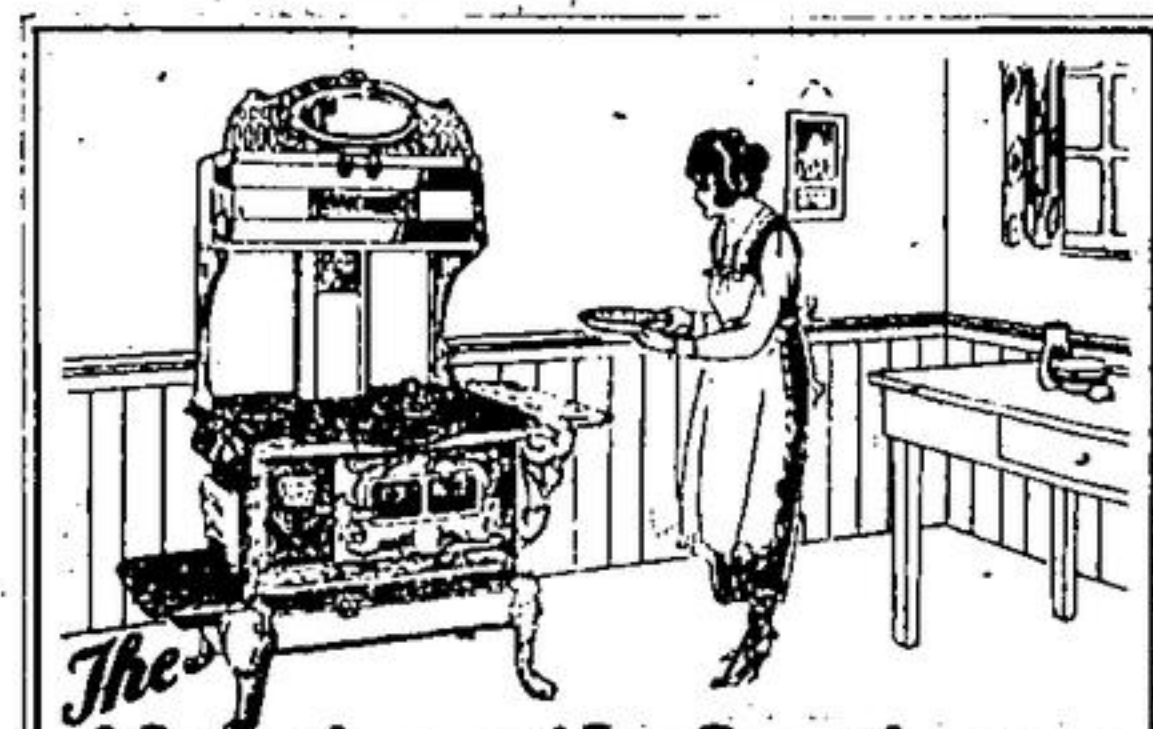

THE FARMER'S HOME MARKET

Low Tariff Politicians belittle its importance. Are they right? What are the Facts?

PROBABLY no part of the business of farming is less understood and less appreciated than the value of the home market to the average Canadian farmer of to-day.

Western wheat farmer out of it, it could be proved that over 80% of what the Ontario farmer produces is consumed by this home market.

The reason some people have an exaggerated idea of the importance of the export market for farm produce is that they have looked at it solely from the standpoint of wheat!

Here is our calculation. Check up our figures from the Canada Year Book, the official statistical publication issued by the Government. Subject our deductions to the most searching investigation and you will find that if we have erred at all, we have under-estimated, rather than over-estimated the importance of the farmer's home market.

Here and There
In appreciation of its wonderful exhibit at the Toronto Exhibition this year, the Canadian Pacific Railway has been awarded a special medal.

The Prince of Wales' Ranch at High River, Alberta, contributed the highest priced bull at a recent fall sale in Calgary, Princeton Canadian, which fetched \$285.

Canadian wheat exports for the twelve months ending September 30th, 1923, amounted to 226,747,861 bushels, valued at \$258,445,516, while for the twelve months ending September, 1922, they were 160,537,888 bushels, valued at \$194,577,126, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

The value of the asbestos exports of Canada for the 12 months ended August, 1923, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, exceeded the value of those of the previous year by nearly \$5,000,000.

The first consignment of 1,000 pounds of British Columbia Douglas fir has been shipped to the British Forestry Commission, London, by the Dominion Forestry Branch, from its plant at New Westminster, British Columbia. The seeds were extracted from the cones recently gathered in the Fraser Valley districts.

The year 1923 will see a new record in Alberta coal production. It is expected the total production for the year will reach 7,000,000 tons, in comparison with less than 6,000,000 last year. The production up to November 1st is 1,500,000 tons greater than the production for the same period last year. The record production previously was in 1920, when 6,400,000 tons were produced. The pay-roll this year is expected to exceed \$18,000,000.

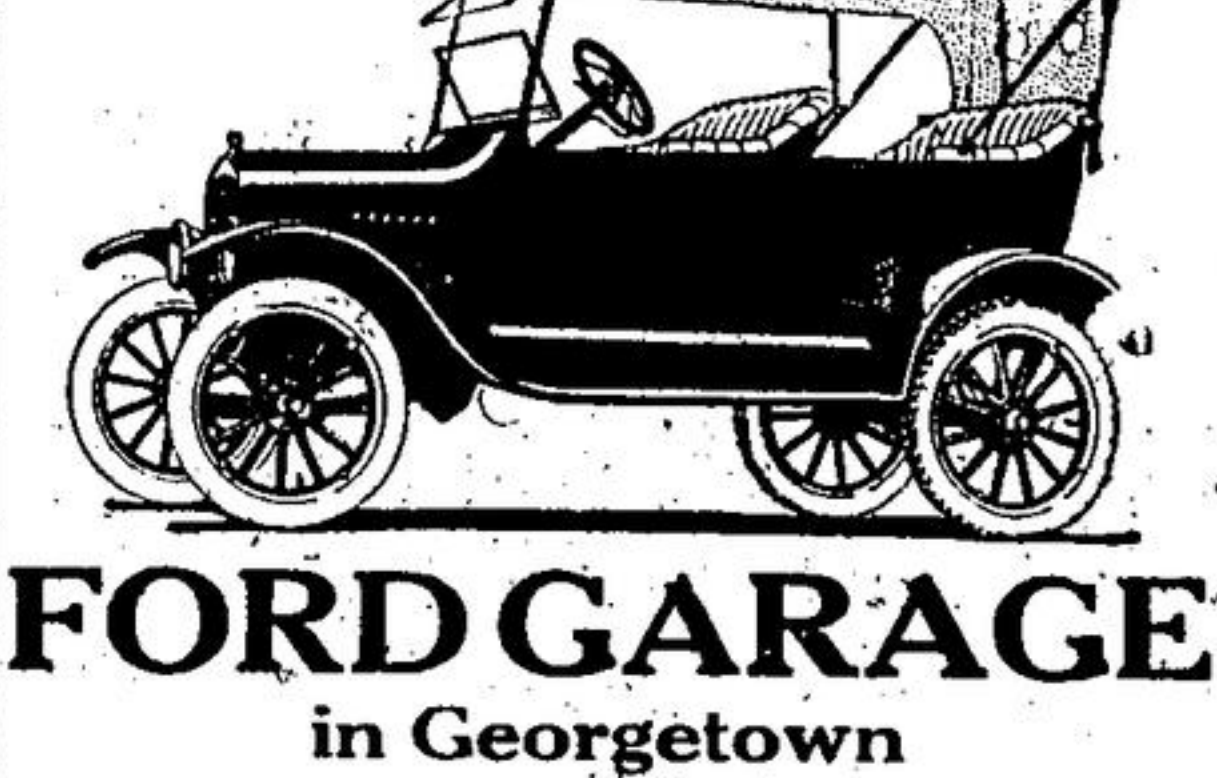
Export Prices that Fail to Govern Home Prices.
In attempts to belittle the home market, the argument has been used over and over again that the prices obtainable in the export market always govern the prices obtainable in the domestic market.

Statements of that kind constitute one of the meanest forms of dishonesty. It is probably true that, in the absence of an effective wheat pool, the Liverpool price pretty nearly fixes the domestic price of wheat. But the Liverpool price of hay, or of potatoes, is almost negligible in its effect upon the local prices obtainable for those commodities in Canada.

Hay and Potatoes for Instance.
In 1923, for instance, farmers in Norfolk County received an average of only 8 1/2 cents a bushel for their potatoes, while farmers in Welland County, less than fifty miles away, received \$1.00 for theirs.

DIPPING FOR THE TICK
SHEEP NEED PROTECTION FROM THIS ANNOYING PARASITE.
How to Use the Dip—A Home-made Dip—Poultry Parasites—Treatment for Hot Fly Larvae—Mineral Mixture.

Before the flock enter winter quarters in the fall they should all receive a thorough dipping. A bright, warm day in October should be chosen and the dipping done in the morning as the wool will have time to dry before shearing. It is safe to say that fall dipping of the flock should never be neglected.

There are several different brands of sheep dip on the market, any one of which will give satisfactory results provided directions are carefully followed. The water to be used for dipping should be warmed and the mixture should be stirred frequently to prevent the heavy dip settling to the bottom.

Unless the flock is a very large one it will not be necessary to build an extensive dipping tank. A large trough or barrel might answer if nothing else is at hand.

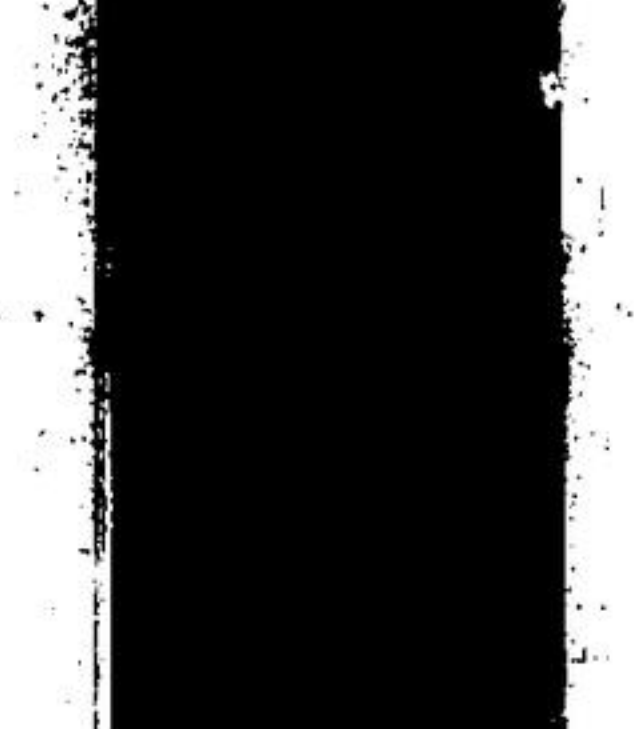
