During the twelve months ended October 31st, 1926, Canada exported to 53 countries and territories 22,903 cars valued at \$28,168,860 and trucks valued at \$5,016,000 and also auto parts worth \$5,573,875.

A total of 12,251 acres was planted to tobacco in Ontario in 1926, yielding 20,823,000 pounds according to figures issued by the Federal Government.

Branch offices of Japanese flour mills are to be established in Winnipeg soon, it is understood, so as to be in a good position to buy wheat.

This is the fiftieth year—the semi-centennial of the Hospital for Sick Children. It is the Golden Anniversary of an institution which started out in 1875 with a staid equipment to care children medically of their illnesses and to rid them surgically of their disabilities.

The people of this province demanded this service—and they have made it possible by their Christmas Time gifts. They are rewarded by the knowledge that thousands of Ontario children will grow up into manhood or womanhood blessing the "little blue coat" wherein they were restored and strengthened to play a full part in the battle of life.

To win back health for six thousand boys and girls was the measure of the Hospital's ward-service alone this year. Besides that there were over half a hundred thousand attended in the Out-patient Department, where the less serious cases are treated.

In order to maintain its high standard of efficiency and also to widen the scope of its service through clinics conducted all over Ontario, the Hospital is compelled to borrow heavily during the year.

On the occasion of its fiftieth Christmas an appeal is made to the public for the funds which will allow the Hospital for Sick Children to enter upon its second half-century of service with its courage renewed by a credit balance in the bank.

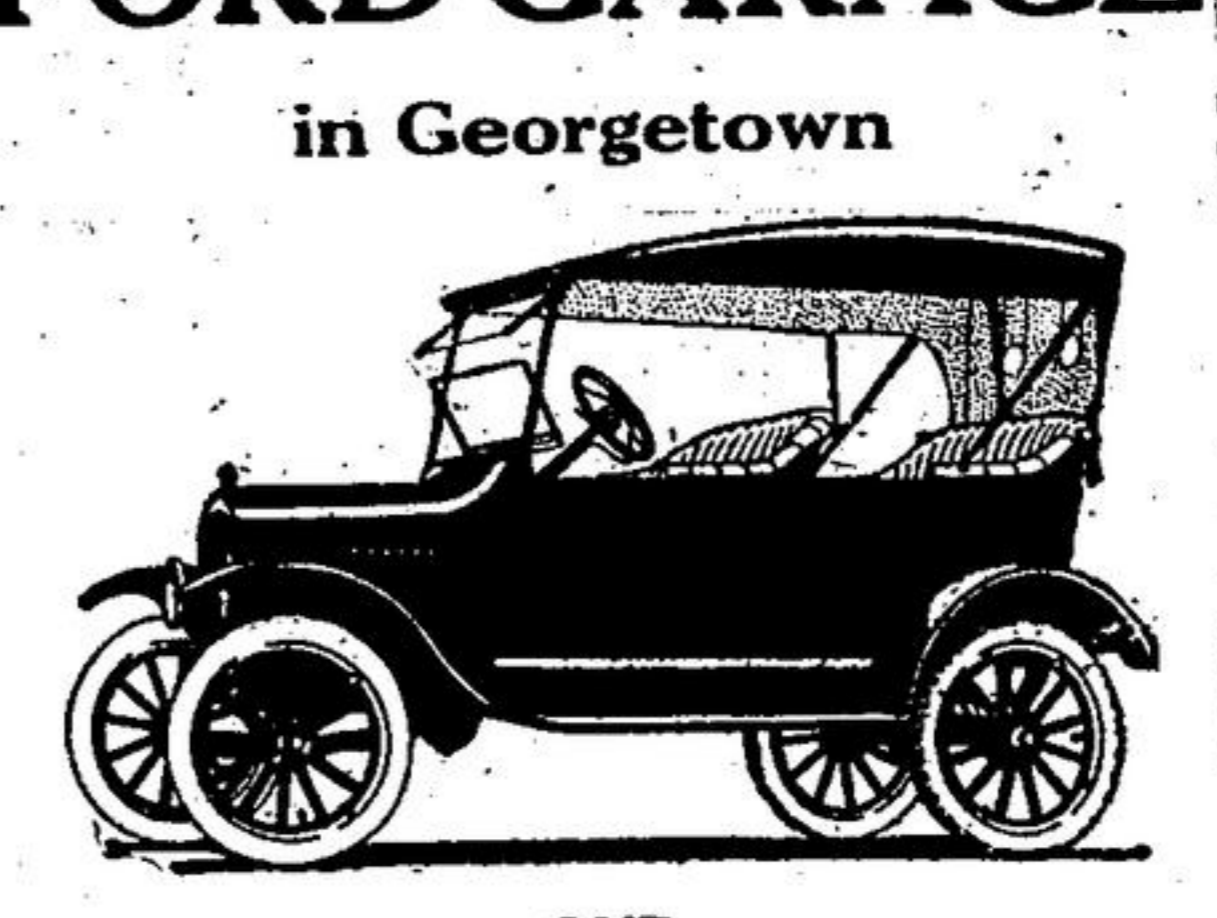

ONT. TOOK MANY PRIZES

WINNING SHOWING OF HOLSTEINS AT NATIONAL DAIRY SHOW

Ontario Department of Agriculture Awarded to Selection and Shipping—State Herd Prize Comes to This Province.

Ontario Holstein breeders have again won a notable success at the National Dairy Show, which this year was held in Indianapolis.

The Ontario breeders entered twenty-four animals—nine bulls and fifteen females, and showed these twenty-four animals against approximately three hundred of the cream of American herds.

The complete report of the winnings shows that Ontario breeders won 4 Dairs, 3 Seconds, 4 Thirds, 2 Fourth, 1 Fifth, 4 Seventh, 1 Eighth, 2 Tenth, and, in addition, won 2 Senior and Grand Champion female, Junior Champion male and first in the State Herd which is the most coveted prize put up by the National Dairy Exposition.

It was generally conceded at Indianapolis that the Ontario exhibit was one of the most uniform, and of highest average quality in that great show of Holsteins.
