NEVER BEFORE in Canada has
the opening of a Parliament
much preliminary interest and specu-
lation. While the whips have been
buying allotting seats and offering
seats to 119 new members, the public
has been waiting for opening day, Janu-
ary 7th, with some impatience, eager
to see what the first vote will bring
forth. The selection of a Speaker will
be the first work of the House, but
this is not expected to precede a
division, as Hon. Louis Robitaille
will be chosen unanimously. On Fri-
day His Excellency will deliver the
Address from the Throne, and if re-
cent practice is followed Parliament
will adjourn until Monday, when the
debate on the address will begin.
There have been occasions—but not
in recent years—when the debate be-
gan the same day as the address, but
this is unlikely in the present in-
stance. In this debate some one will
move, probably Mr. Meighen, an
amendment challenging the authority
of the Government to continue in of-
fice. It is on this amendment that
the test of strength is expected. If,
however, the debate on the address
starts on Friday, it is quite possible
that the test will come upon motion
by a Conservative member for ad-
journment over the week end. The
composition of the House on the day
of opening will be: Conservatives 116,
Liberals 101, from which there must
be a deduction of one for Speaker;
Forces Progressives 12, Independent
Progressives 18, Labor 2, and one in-
dependent, Henri Bourassa.
