Farm Crop Experiments

We are informed by Dr. C. A. Zavitz, Agricultural College, Guelph, that 800 Ontario farmers conducted experiments with field crops on their own farms in 1925. The number increasing from year to year. Choice seed of some of the best varieties is being distributed free of cost. Any farmer who asks for it may have the seed for an experiment with one of the classes of farm crops such as oats, field corn, mangolds, turnips, alfalfa, sweet corn, etc. The distribution will likely continue well into April or until the supply of seed of the different crops is exhausted. These cooperative tests of the experiment al union have greatly increased crop yields making Ontario outstanding in this respect.

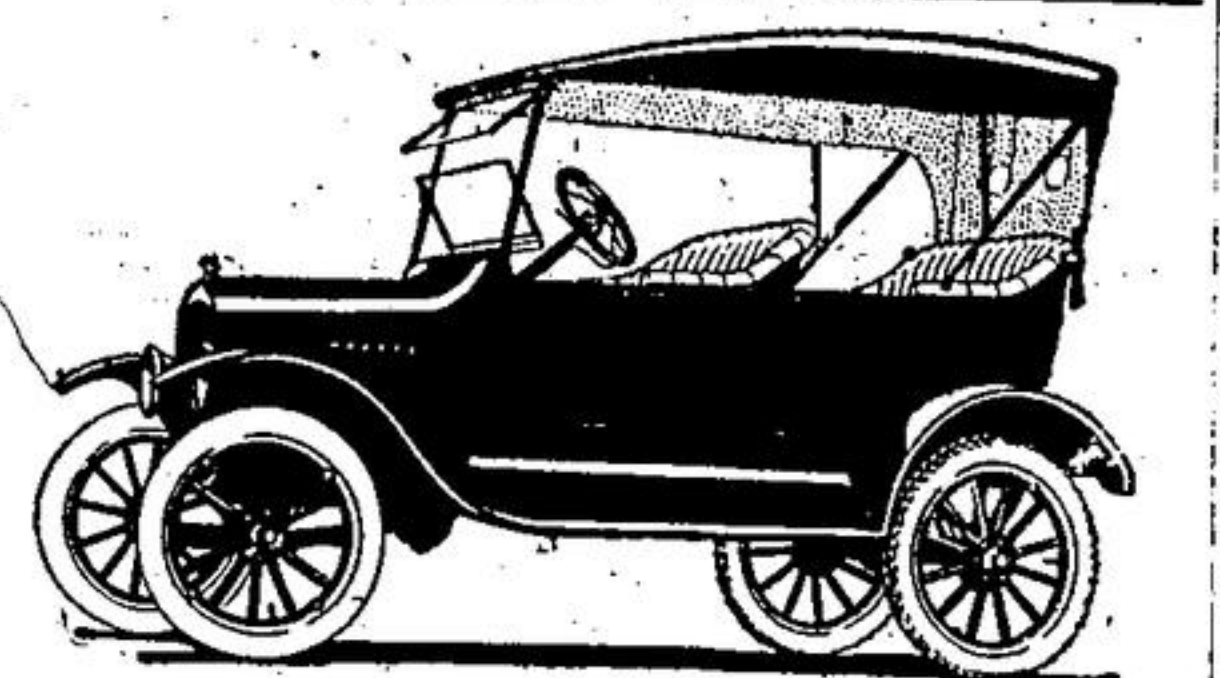

New Cow Testing Policy

In order that dairymen may obtain something definite in the way of milk testing the Ontario Department of Agriculture has undertaken a new cow testing policy. So far as Halton is concerned the organization will be in the hands of the Agricultural Representative. Meetings for organization will be held in the near future. In order that trucks can deliver samples for testing, testing stations for the county will be at Toronto and Hamilton. The testing will be done by government testers under the Dairy Branch. The records will be forwarded to the Agricultural Representative and the test will be recorded, the number of pounds of milk and number of pounds of butter fat estimated. Completed forms will be forwarded monthly to the farmer and at the end of the year he will receive a yearly sheet or book showing the yearly production of each cow in his herd. This sheet of immense value to the dairyman in order that he may check up on his boarder cows.
