Peel Progressives Select J. W. Taylor

H. J. W. Taylor, well-known Chinguacousy farmer, received the Progressive nomination for the Legislature for Peel County at the third party's convention in the Fosters Hall, Brampton, last Fri day afternoon.

Ramors had been rife that Hon. W. E. Raney M.P.P. Progressive Leader. was willing to accept the nomination and accordingly, he was named at the meeting, 115 of the 125 delegates present voting for him. The nomination did not remain, however, as Roebuck of Toronto apponneed that he was at the convention as Mr. Raney's representative, and speaking for the Leader, would decline the honor. Several others were nominated, but all withdrew in favor of dir. Taylor.

Mr. Taylor has been prominent for some time as a member of the various farmer clubs. In the Federal election of 1921 be carried the Progressive banner against both Liberal and Conservative candidates. The Conservative candidates, S. C. 
