**Institution and Induction**

**Rev. F. H. Wase Inducted Rector of St. George's and St. Alban's Churches.**

The Induction of Rev. F. H. Wase as Rector of St. George's and St. Alban's Churches of Georgetown and Glen Williams, took place in St. George's Church, last Wednesday evening in the presence of a very large gathering.

The ceremony of induction through-out was very impressive and was taken part in by Right Rev. Derwyn T. Owen, Bishop of Niagara; Rev. Dr. Hughall, the Dean of Niagara; Rev. Canon Ferguson, Sec. of the Diocese; Rev. Geo. Laxton, Hamilton; Ven. Archbishop Scovell, M.A., Rev. J. A. M. Bell, B.A., Guelph; Rev. Canon Naftel, Milton; Rev. Dr. Kyle, Norval; Rev. Mr. Andrews, Lowville, and Rev. Mr. Dewey of Acton.

The newly inducted Rector was presented with the keys of St. George's Church by Mr. L. P. Denison, People's Wardman; and by Mr. E. Right Rev. Derwyn T. Owen, Bishop of Niagara, chose as his text for the sermon on this occasion, the 4th and 5th verses of the 12th Chapter of St. Paul's Epistle to the Romans, viz.—"For as we have many members in one body, and all members being made of one flesh, and one bone, and we being many, yet one body in Christ, and everyone members one of another."

The speaker said in part:—"There are four centres of interest around the induction service of the Rector of this Parish. First, the man, second, the Parish, third, the Diocese, fourth, out beyond the Diocese. The man, Rev. Mr. Wase, I have known for the past 12 years, and intimately for the past 10 years, and he is one whose desire is the highest interests for the advancement and upbuilding of a Great Church. You have needed him a happy welcome and should be ready to co-operate with him. He loves God and has devoted his life to Christ. While he is looking out for others do your part towards helping and strengthening him in the great work for the Master."

The Parish of St. George's and St. Alban's has a long and splendid history. It is a central place with beautiful buildings and a record of good honest God-fearing work that must be lived up to. The congregations are included in the obligations to their matter of co-operation, service and prayer. The Christian life is the greatest in the world. Witness for Christ as you are pledged to serve, follow and witness. Do you utmost by prayer, love and unity that the Church may continue to be a real witness for God and everything that is right.

You belong to a Diocese in which all have part in the responsibilities and privileges and must share in the up-keep.

Out beyond the Diocese you are a part of a great church, a world-wide church. You belong to a great organization, a great power, in whose ranks are great saints of God. To be strong in our parish we must think of others outside. Pray for your Rector and co-operate with him, stand by the Parish by witnessing, love your fellow-men and show that the Church stands for something real and true. Remember the Diocese and remember the Church throughout the world. All belong to Christ who Himself is the head of the Church. All our power comes from Christ. He is the redeeming power and sits at the right hand of God his Father on the Throne. First and last, the beginning and the end, Christ is all; without Him no church could function and the world would be powerless. Unto Him I commend you all."

The singing of hymn 410, closing prayer and blessing, followed by Recessional hymn 286, brought this beautiful service to a close.

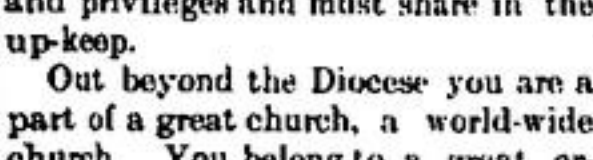

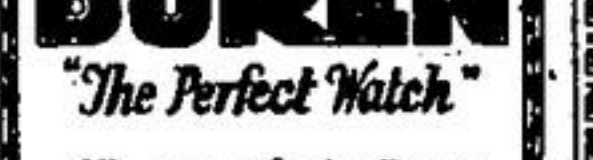

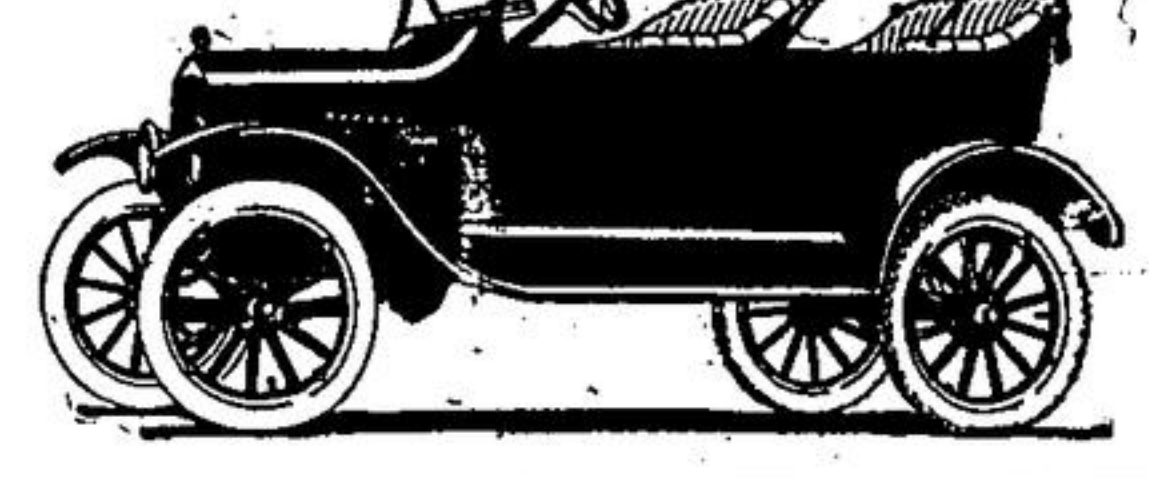
