Here and There

Southern holiday resorts received a setback when the Quarter Million Dollar Club of the Canada Life Assurance Company, of Toronto, deelded to substitute Quebec City for Miami as the place of meeting of their Convention this winter.

According to the provincial aplarist, the value of honey, wax and other products of the hive in Quebec in 1925 amounted to \$2,395,553. More than 1,100 new apiculturists were, registered during the year, bringing the total to 7,729, possessing 100.155 colonies of bees.

A magnificent silver dish, twenty inches in diameter, presented by King Emmanuel of Portugal to the famous explorer Vasca da Gama in 1499, in recognition of the latter's discovery of the sea route to India, setracted much attention while on exhibition in the downtown offices of the Canadian Pacific Rallway in Montreal.


