The financial statement of the Canadian Pacific Railway issued at Montreal for the seven (months of 1926-ending July 31st, shows the large increase in the net profits of \$6,691,301.52 over the net profits for the first seven months of 1925. The gross carnings were \$101,826,207.11, as compared with \$90,343,867.75 for the first seven months of 1925.

Unofficial estimates prepared by the authorities of the Department of Commerce, Washington, estimated that American's visiting Canada this year would spend approximately \$190,000,000. This estimate was intimated to be very conservative and that it was more than likely that the amount would exceed the \$200,-000,000 mark.


