Robb, Acting Prime Minister, stated today that in accordance with the arrangements for Armistice Day sanctioned by His Majesty the King, the people of Canada are invited to mark the occasion by two minutes of silence at 11 o'clock Thursday morning, Nov. 11. 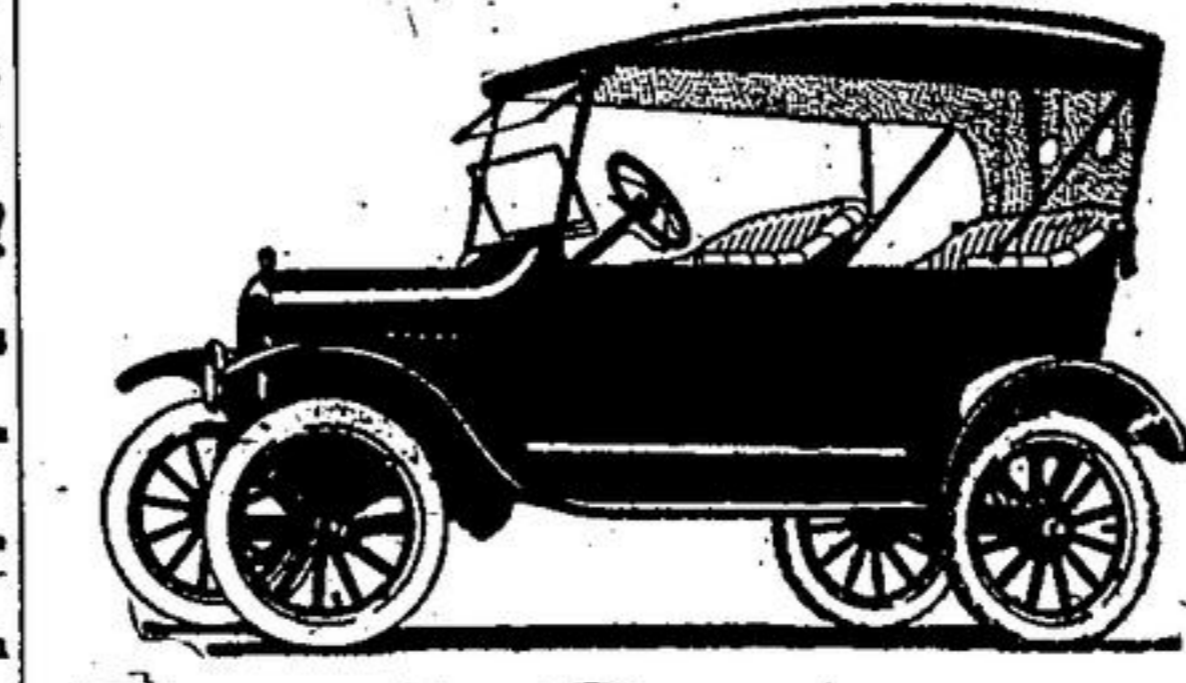
