Prisoner Facing Four-Year Sentence - le Wed in Milton

By permission of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council Bert D'Angelo, the 32-year-old Hamilton fruit peddler, who at the Fall Assizes at Milton on Saturday, No. 20, was sentenced to four years in Kingston Penitentiary by Mr. Justice Rose for having sold the poison alcohol which caused the death of William Maybee of Oakville last summer, was last evening quietly married to Miss Januett Blair Goodlet, a 26-year-old Scottish lassic of Toronto, formerly of Port Credit. After the ceremony, D'Angelo kiss-ed his bride good-bye and returned to his cell, while his wife left on the next train for Toronto. D'Angelo has appealed his sentence and is anxiously awaiting the court's decision in the matter. If he wins his appeal he and his bride will immediately take up their residence in Hamilton.


