D'ANGELO MARRIED IN SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Prisoner Facing Four-Year Sentence Is Wed in Milton

By permission of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council Bert D'Angelo, the 22-year-old Hamilton fruit peddler, who at the Fall Assizes at Milton on Saturday, No. 26, was sentenced to four years in Kingston Penitentiary by Mr. Justice Rose for having sold the poison alcohol which caused the death of William Mayhew of Oakville last summer, was last evening quietly married to Miss Jannett Blair Gosslet, a 20-year-old Scottish lassie of Toronto, formerly of Fort Credit.

The interesting ceremony was solemnized in Sheriff Webster's office in the Court House here by Rev. Canon L. J. R. Natfel, M.A., rector of Grace Anglican Church, Milton. The happy couple were unattended. Besides W. L. Dick, County Crown Attorney, and W. Epton, County Clerk, who were the two official witnesses, there were also present Sheriff Webster, W. E. Yates, Sheriff's Clerk, and Governor McCibbon of the jail.

After the ceremony, D'Angelo kissed his bride good-bye and returned to his cell, while his wife left on the next train for Toronto. D'Angelo has appealed his sentence and is anxiously awaiting the court's decision in the matter. If he wins his appeal he and his bride will immediately take up their residence in Hamilton.

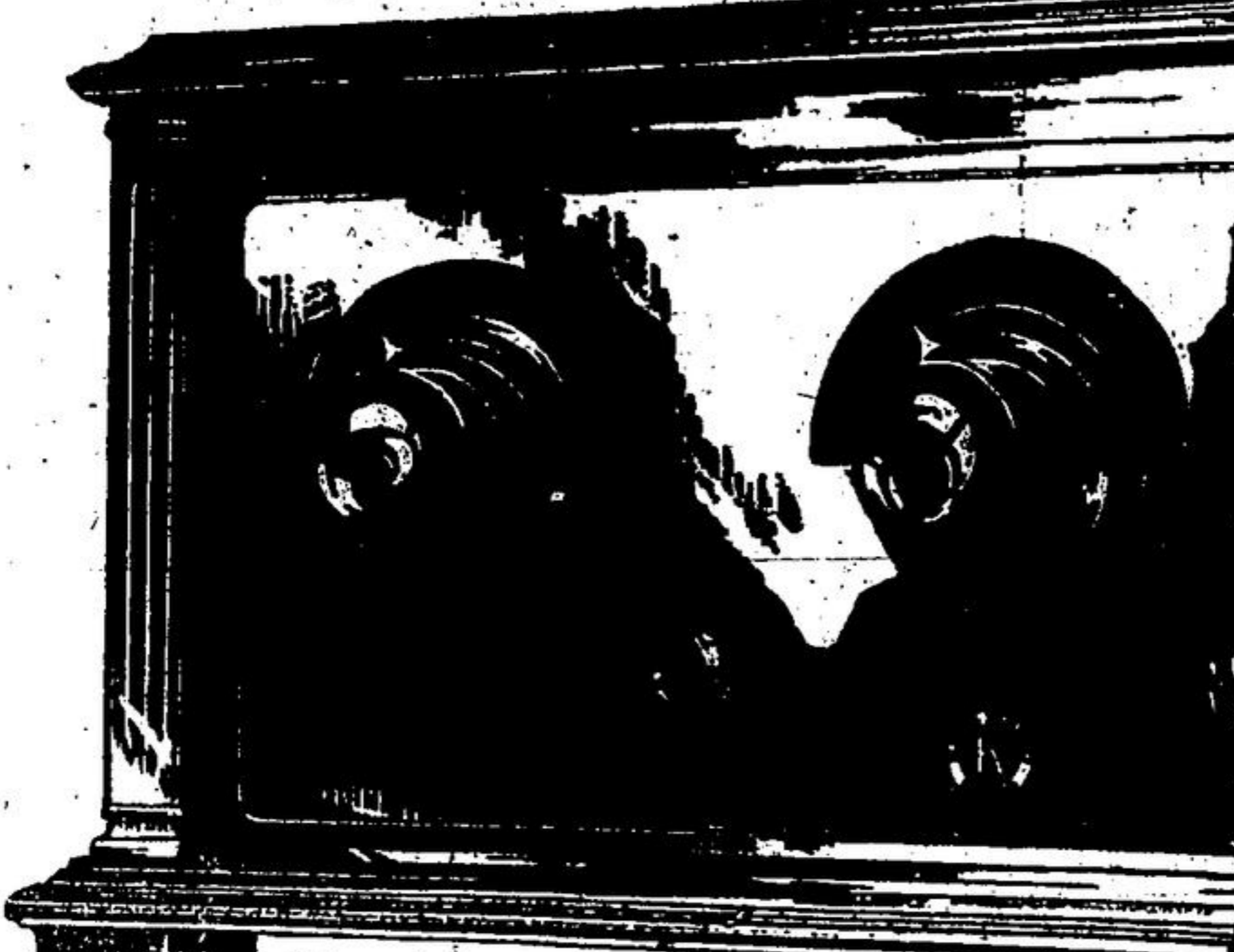

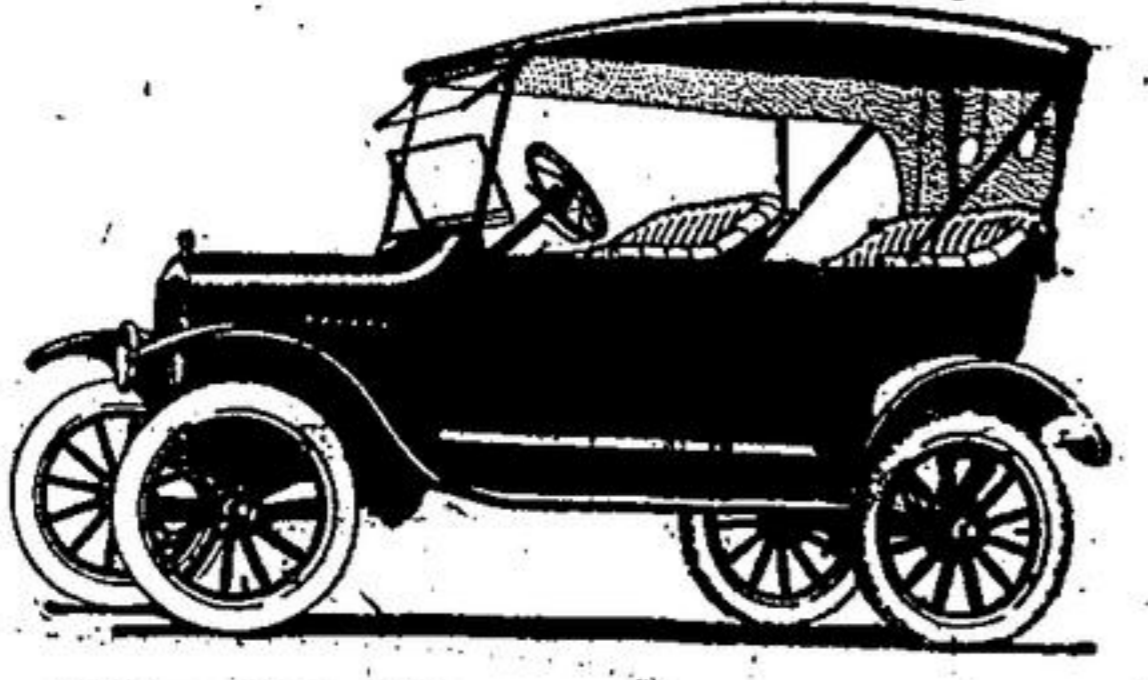
