County Council Asked to Act re Protecting Pheasants

The final meeting of the Halton county council was held yesterday, and in the evening Warden Blain of Milton gave the time-honored warden's dinner in the Milton Inn. The fact that gun licenses must be obtained before hunters can go a hunting in Wentworth, Lincoln and other adjoining counties has prompted the Game Protective Association of Halton county to petition the county council to take steps to make the same law for Halton county.
