

KING OF SHIPPING WORLD

LORD KYLIANT IN DIRECTOR OF PORTY ORGANIZATIONS.

His Rise to Power Has Been So Silent That to Many He is a Discovery - Comes of Distinguished Welsh Family.

By virtue of his recent purchase of the White Star Line, Lord Kyliant, chairman of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company, becomes the world's largest shipping operator. Although his name has been known for years, his rise to power has been so silent that to many people on this side of the Atlantic he is a discovery.

Those who know him say that he is a smoothly running human dynamo, almost silent, often invisible in the very places where his activities are being met in the forty organizations of which he is a director.

One of the striking features of his career is that he did not come of a seaman stock and was not steeped in marine traditions as a young man.

Lord Kyliant, or rather Owen Cooby Phillips, as he was then, is the same chairman of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company in 1902, and to his policy of constant rejuvenation the growth of that corporation is attributed.

The Royal Mail, founded early in the last century, long before the advent of steam, was the first to carry British mail to the West Indies and South America.

It was the same tradition as the East India Company, which once had a navy of its own, or of the Peninsular and Oriental, the P. & O., which "with the gorgeous fleet of its ships" "brings the coming of steam to take the place of sail."

When Lord Kyliant took over the shipping world the old Royal Mail was growing in power and influence and extending its reach to all the chief ports of the world.

It is the development of motor vessels Lord Kyliant has also been very active in the development of motor vessels and electrically propelled boats.

In his personal habits and tastes Lord Kyliant is very simple, almost abstemious. He does not care for either elaborate fare or rare viandts.

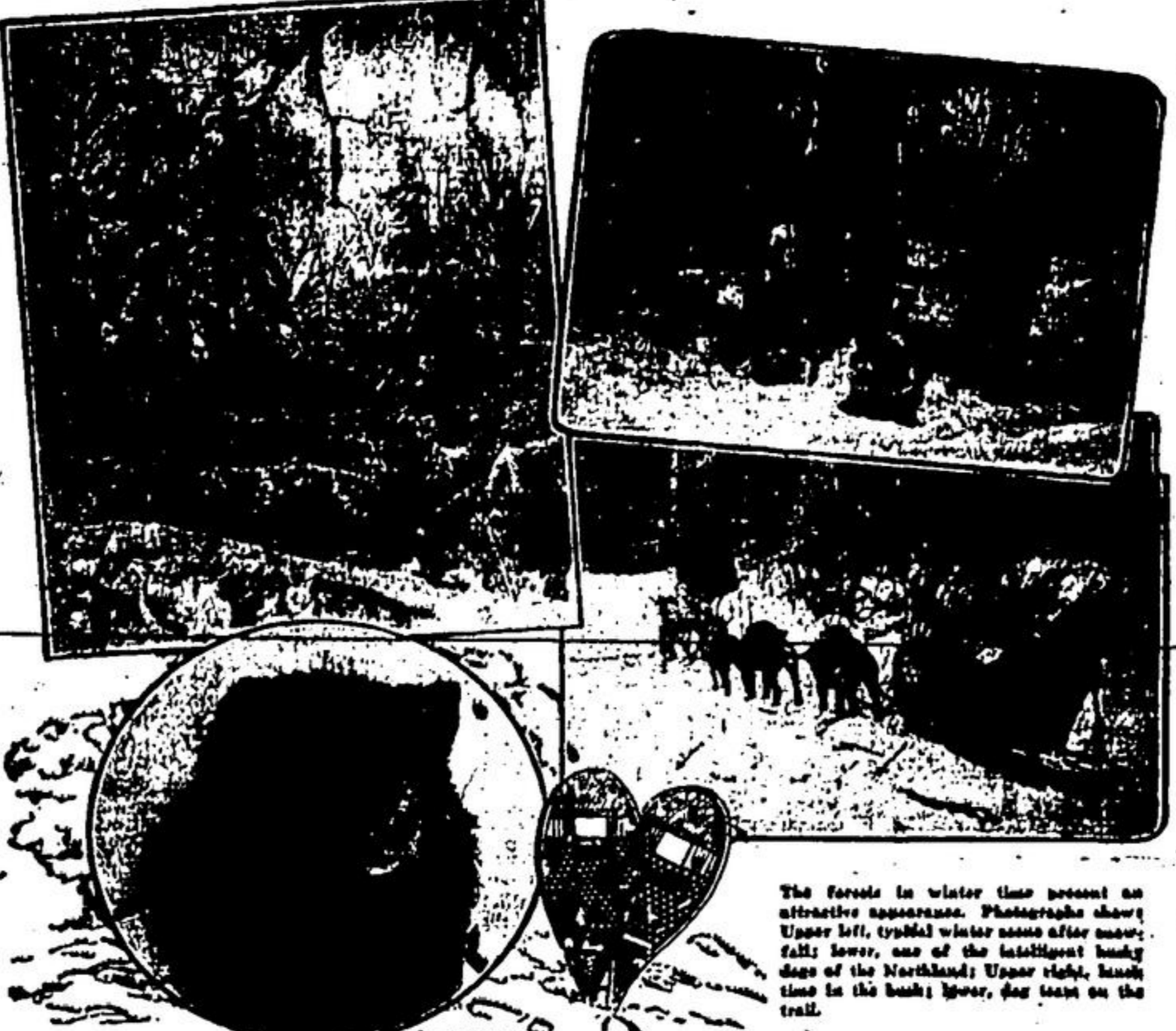
