Here and There

In the year ending June 30th last, 4,077 mining claims were staked in the Province of Quebec, covering an area of 485,000 acres, according to a preliminary report.

Tobacco growing is becoming a serious business proposition in the vicinity of Kelowna, B.C. Two hundred acres will be planted out at Kelowna, Cawston, Oliver and Osoyoos next year, while the acreage at Kelowna will also be increased.

Northern Alberta's wolf population is of large dimensions, no less than 50,000 skins having been shipped out of this province as furs in the last year. They form a substantial source of revenue to trappers in the wilds.

Nova Scotia breeding pens are beginning to attract the attention of Great Britain. John R. McMullen, of this city, has just shipped to Chivers and Son, Cambridge, England, four barred Plymouth Rock cockerels. This is the second shipment of breeding stock made to this firm.

Curling history of a unique nature was made in Quebec city recently when the Jacques Cartier Curling Club, the first French-Canadian curling organization in the world, was inaugurated and their new curling rink formally opened.

The World's Poultry Congress to be held at Ottawa July 27th to August 4th next is to be a big affair in every sense. Plover space will be more than 500,000 square feet; the national educational exhibits utilizing \$5,000 of that footage.

Nickell of Limehouse was awarded as winner of first prize in the old-time fiddlers contest at Toronto Exhibition last year, he has been presented with a beautiful Diploma, appropriately worded, and having his name engraved thereon, as winner in the contest.

In the design of the Canadian National Exhibition 1926 Award to successful competitors in the various classes and departments the new Province of Ontario Building is featured, as marking the beginning of a new era in the development of the World's greatest annual exposition, an era to be featured, it is hoped, by similar enterprises on the part of other Provinces and Canada, by Great Britain and other units of Empire together with various foreign countries, representing the Arts of Peace of every race and clime.

The symbolic figures of Science, Industry, Agriculture and Art, depicting their various contributions of human achievement are grouped on the pediment at the top of the design, and below on each side the Musical features of the exposition are typified by the Muse with lute and pipe, seated beneath the wild olive trees of traditional Greek myth.

The official seal of the C.N.E. with the signatures of the chief executive officers endorsing the award, complete the design in the panel at the base.
