The Unlimited All-Risks Automobile Policy provides unlimited coverage for Public Liability, Property Damage, Collision, Fire, Theft, Transportation, with additional features as described below.

Public Liability and Property Damage
(Injuries to public or damage to the property of others.)

Up to an unlimited amount, either for one person or one accident, including Law Costs.

The Unlimited All-Risks policy protects the Assured against claims, not only while driving his own car, but while driving any private car other than his own. The importance of this will be obvious, as a driver may be proceeded against jointly with or independently of the Owner of the Car.

Collision and Damage to Car
Including Transit and Transportation

Many forms of damage can occur to a Car which do not come within the interpretation of the word collision, and are therefore, technically outside the standard policy. This policy covers additional hazards such as Upset or Overturning, Flood, Malicious Damage, Windstorm, articles falling on Car, Exterior explosion, and All Damage in Transit or Transportation.
