After November 30th every applicant for a Motor Vehicle Operator's. License will be required to pass an examination of fitness and ability before an inspector of the Department of Highways. This examination will take some time and will cost a fee of \$1.00.

It will be assumed after the above date that every experienced and capable driver will have heeded the law and secured a license. If you have been careless in not applying for your Motor Vehicle Operator's License, you will save yourself inconvenience, time and money, by making application now. An application form can be secured at any

Licenses are now issued without examination to those who have driven a car at least six months and for at least 500 miles, and also have no physical or mental disability which may interfere with the operation of a motor car. The fee for a license is \$1.00 and licenses now issued will be good until December 31st, 1928.

·Licenses must be carried by drivers at all times. In case of accident or infraction of The Highway Traffic Act, drivers without Motor Vehicle Operator's Licenses cannot be considered as experienced and competent.
