He said in part:—"If we have not entered into fellowship with Jesus Christ we are dead. Through Christ we gain the highest type of character and personality in its noblest form. The main concern of life is not the Public life and social problems of today need noble men and women of character. The perils that threaten man to-day are that his intellectual powers will outstrip his religious and moral attainments. Education is all right but it cannot do everything; it does not mean that a man is moral and good living. Clever and educated men have been a curse to their country because they lacked character and moral stamina. Education is not our great problem to-day. It is character, forbearance and universal love. We cannot enter into character except by Jesus Christ, who stands as the master of the art of living. If you want to enter into life you must let Christ fashion and shape your character. Christ gives moral and spiritual power. We don't do wrong things because we don't know they are wrong. Victims of alcohol know its evil can't shake it off themselves. Sex instinct is not controlled by knowledge. To control self and live pure, clean and upright lives we must have Christ to get power. Christianity is spiritual union with Christ. Personality must have power that makes for righteousness and in Christ our only hope lies. When God is acting in the heart man finds a new power at work in his life. He that lives in spiritual union with Christ has power and he that has Christ has character. God does not want selfish Christianity, for what is good for yourself is good for others and every true Christian should become a moral and spiritual dynamo in the betterment of others. With Christ we may be able to shake our day and generation. Let us enter into life here and really and truly find Christ. He that hath Christ hath life; he that hath not Christ hath not life. May the spirit strive that you may yield yourself to Christ and find life."

The pulpit was decorated with beautiful flowers for the occasion and special music was rendered by the choir which was enjoyed and appreciated by the large gathering. Rev. Dr. Webb of Quebec and Rev. K. Maclean of the Presbyterian church assisted at the morning service, while Rev. Dr. Dickie of the United Church assisted at the evening service.
