Saint John.—An epoch in the transportation of cargo between Canada and the United Kingdom was effected recently when W. H. MacInnes, vice-president in charge of traffic of the Canadian Pacific Railway, W. A. Wainwright, assistant to the chairman, with other officials of the railway, inspected the C. P. fast cargo line "Beaverburn," which recently docked here, completing her maiden voyage.

According to a report covering the activities of the past year of the Canada Colonization Association, a subsidiary of the Canadian Pacific Railway, 526 families, consisting of 2,444 persons, were settled on 182,982 acres of land by the association. The value of these transactions is in excess of \$6,000,000.

Vancouver.—In an address before the Board of Trade upon the services rendered the Dominion by the late Sir William Van Horne, founder of the city of Vancouver and president of the Canadian Pacific Railway, C. A. Colwell, general superintendent of the railway's British Columbia district, said: "The Canadian Pacific Railway is the largest taxpayer and the largest purchaser in the province; it spent last year \$20,760,000 in stores and supplies, taxes, wages, etc.
