Beautiying The Bome Grounds

More attention than ever before is now being given to making the appearance of dwellings more attractive. The difficulty is to know just what to do at the least expense. Shrubbery with a few flowers usually is all that is becessary to take away the bare look and make the home

much more inviting. In some cases it may be necessary to grade the lawn to make a more even surface, or an extension of the laws surface may be desirable to give a better setting to the buildings. An application of one to two pounds of limestone, and one quarter to one half pound of basic slag, per square yard will supply the elements usually lacking and help to secure a good Where the seed that is sown and dies stand of Kentucky blue grass, which in the best lawn grass. One quarter ounce of this grass seed to a square yard, scattered evenly, is thick enough, and good lawns are possible

> It is wise to use some shrubbery toward the corner of the house and at each side of the entrance to the house. The heavier and deeper plants should be at the comers with lighter plantings at the entrance, Shrubbery useful for planting is not very expensive if small plants about 18 inches tall are used. The small plants transplant more easily and they will soon grow to give the de sired effect. 
