The old little homestead, a landmark of 168 years' standing, below Norval, was destroyed by fire Monday afternoon. The loss is about \$3,000. The fire started in a bedroom. The high wind storm blowing rendered efforts to conquer the fire futile. The house passed from the Smellie owners to Mr. W. Thompson, before coming into possession of Albert Hunter, the present owner of 108 years. The building was a frame structure, and had been kept in a good state of preservation.
