

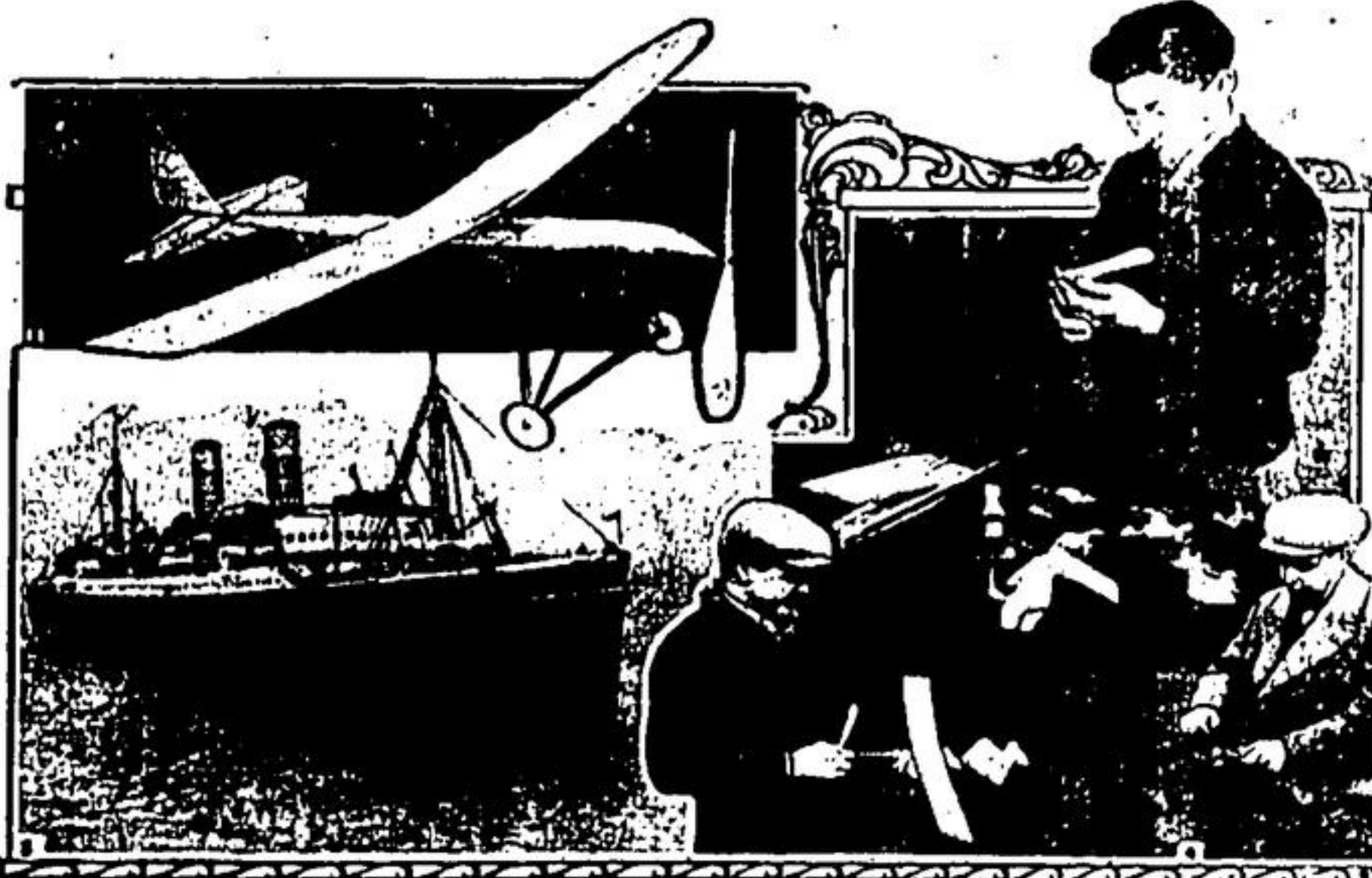

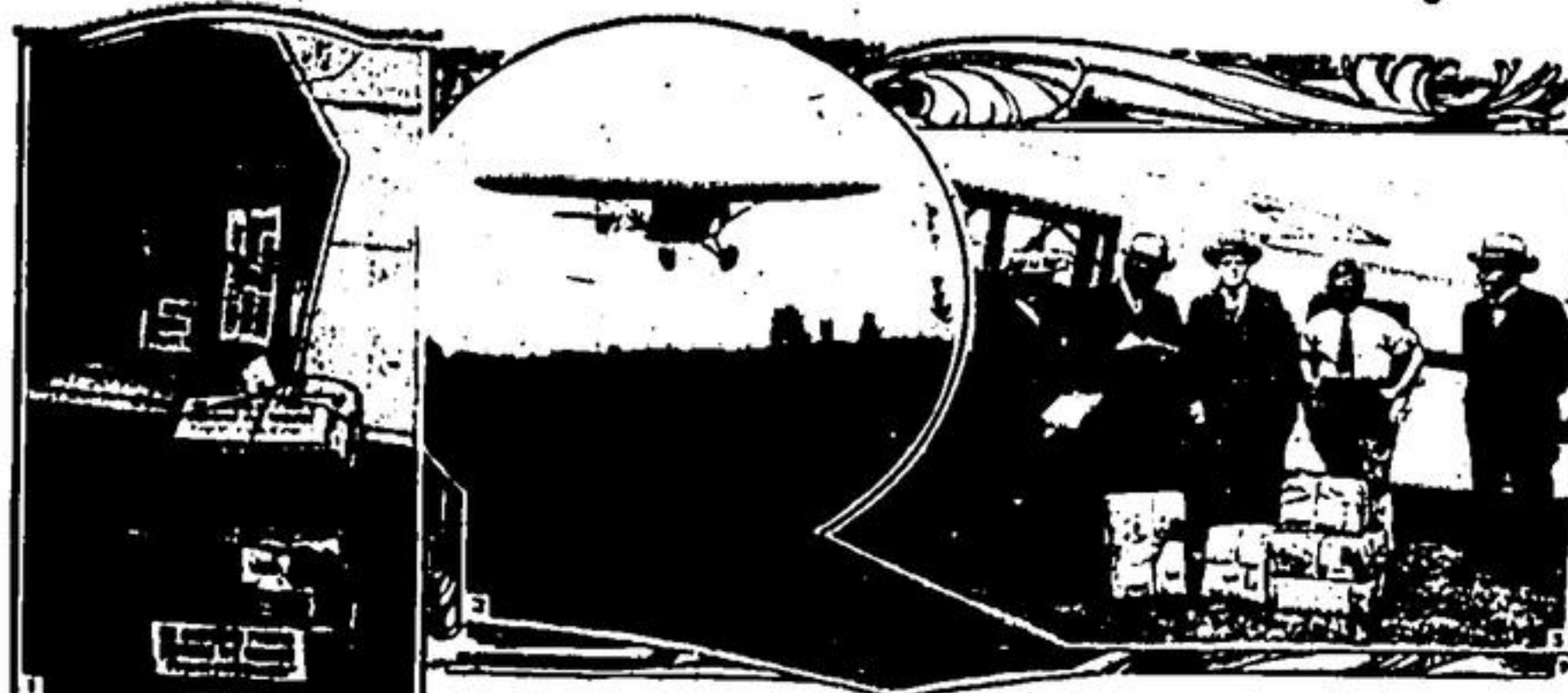
Use Model Airplanes on Trip to Europe

Less than seven days after leaving the shipper in London, England, four packages of merchandise totalling forty two pounds in weight were recently delivered to Montreal in London, Ontario.

Here and There

Half a million automobiles from the United States and the provinces of Canada, carrying a million and a half persons, will enter Montreal during the coming tourist season, according to the estimate of the Montreal Tourist and Convention Bureau.

The use of the combine is expected to be more general than ever in the 1928 harvest. In 1927 there were 176 combines in the Prairie Provinces, 748 being in Saskatchewan, 207 in Alberta and 3 in Manitoba.

Equaling the speed across the Atlantic ocean made by passenger liners of medium size, the five 3000-ton vessels of the "Big Five" class have been achieving records in oceanic freight transportation for the Canadian Pacific Steamship.

Chicago.—"Smiling Billy Hogan," veteran C.P.R. conductor, took "The Mountaineer," Canadian Pacific flyer from Chicago to Vancouver out in its initial run of the season this year.

Montreal.—A new era in Canadian trans-Atlantic passenger history has been inaugurated in Montreal, where the fine new liner "Duchess of Bedford" docked recently.

The Feast of St. John the Baptist, greatest of French Canadian religious spectacles, will be celebrated throughout the province of Quebec shortly.

Here and There

The Duchess of Bedford, latest addition to the Canadian Pacific's fleet of passenger liners on the Atlantic, is the first of four cabin class vessels being constructed for the company's service on the St. Lawrence route, and they will also be used for winter cruise purposes.

Winnipeg.—According to statistics recently collected from 248,122 farms, there are 6.8 horses to each farm in Manitoba and one tractor to every 4.6 farms in the province.

Ottawa, Ontario.—Employment stood at a higher level in Canada in April, 1928, than in any April as far back as records go.

Winnipeg.—Homestead entries in the four Western Provinces for the first quarter of the year totalled 1,816, as compared with 1,030 in the first quarter of 1927.

Earnings and expenses statement of the Canadian Pacific Railway for the month of April, issued from headquarters of the company, show net profits up \$180,944.85 as compared with April of last year.

The English Rugby League Football team, at the present time touring Australia and New Zealand, is scheduled to arrive at Vancouver on R. M. S. Niagara, September 16, and will play a game there next day, leaving on the Trans-Canada afterwards for Montreal where another game will be played September 20, before sailing for England on the Duchess of Athol next day.
