Three Children Dead and Father Injured in Motor Crash

Jimmy, aged 10; Betty, aged 7, and Phyllis, aged 5, Children of Mr. and Mrs. G. C. Brown, Norval, were killed and Mr. Brown seriously injured when a motor car crashed into a crossing near Norval Station last Saturday.

Obituary

George B. Thompson

After a brief illness the death occurred at his residence on 7 lot 15 Esqueping township of George B. Thompson in his 63rd year. A son of the late William L. Thompson and Elizabeth Thompson. His wife Annie Ross predeceased him 14 years ago. He was a descendant of an old pioneer family being born and having lived all his life on the home place. He was an Anglican in religion, Conservative in politics, and a member of L.O.L. 68 and Canadian Order of Foresters. Deceased was well known, having been assessor of the township for many years, giving him a wide acquaintance in the region. There is a clear view of the main centre road from Norval that crosses the tracks within 10 yards. The auto, a sedan, did not stop for the radial. It is thought Mr. Brown was under the impression that the radial would stop at the platform tank station where the freight was packed. Whether the motorist expected the auto to stop or not, both kept on going with the inevitable result. There was a terrific impact, the auto was thrown into the air and landed on the east side of the tracks under a slight embankment. The radial was travelling so fast, say eyewitnesses, that it did not stop until it had travelled about 60 yards. Help came within a minute after the crash, which could be heard in the village. The three children had been crushed by the impact of the auto and radial coming together, and out by the flying glass. Glass soon was scattered all over. The children were thrown out on to the soft grassy ground, when the body of the car literally broke up into pieces as it hit the ground after the crash. When willing hands removed sufficient debris and glass to lift out the children, it was found that Jimmy and Betty, eldest boy and eldest girl, were dead. Death was instantaneous. Little Phyllis, the youngest child, was terribly injured and bled profusely and was rushed to the home of G. C. McLaughlin, next-door neighbor of the Brown family in the village of Norval. Mr. Brown himself, was more fortunate; besides deep lacerations he received fractures of arm and hip bones. He was taken to St. Joseph's hospital, Guelph.
